Beloved OCCUMC Family,

You've likely heard the terms "Re-wilding," "Green Effort," and "Environmental Design," being mentioned around the church the last few months. It's possible you may be wondering what these terms mean in the big picture of ministry at OCCUMC, so I wanted to take a moment to share the divine inspiration that has been sparked.

As we look around our church property, we see a gift—acres of green lawn that stretch around our building, a beautiful but often underutilized space. What if we began to see this land not just as something to maintain, but as a ministry waiting to happen?

God has blessed us with space that could be so much more than grass. Imagine a vibrant community garden where fresh vegetables grow and neighbors come together. Picture a small orchard producing fruit—both literal and spiritual. Think of outdoor gathering spaces for fellowship, worship, and prayer. Envision a peaceful walking trail for quiet reflection, exercise, or conversation with a friend.

These ideas aren't just about beautifying our campus, they're about cultivating connection, hospitality, and outreach. By reimagining our lawn as a place of ministry, we live out our calling to be good stewards of God's creation. Genesis reminds us that we were placed in the garden to "work it and take care of it" (Genesis 2:15), and today, we have the chance to do just that. Caring for the land in a way that honors God and serves others.

This is about more than planting seeds in the soil; it's about planting hope, joy, and community. Let's continue praying and dreaming together about how God might use every part of our church (yes, even the lawn) for God's glory.

Summer is here and it seems to be flying by.



Our team has taken a little break from meetings, but will be back at it in September.

We don't have any major projects planned, although we are taking care of some required items on our list. These include servicing the doors at the Gathering Area entrance and addressing some maintenance needs on some of the furnace units in preparation for colder temperatures.



You will no doubt have noticed the addition of two small green dumpsters to our parking lot. The change came about due to the fact that our current provider, Waste Management, no longer supports curbside pickup for "commercial" locations so this is the only way garbage pickup for the church can occur.

The Fall season on our church calendar means many things, including preparing budgets for 2026. In general, we use the current year as a guide for drafting the budget for the following year, allowing for increases in services provided by various 3rd party partners who we rely on to help keep things running smoothly. As with your personal budgets, no doubt, we always look for opportunities to reduce our costs as part of the budgeting process.

We also monitor all of our assets including the status of our roofs, windows, etc. To this end, we recently obtained quotes to review the condition and replacement cost of the parsonage roof and church garage roof. The good news is that while the parsonage roof is old and approaching its



end of life, it is still in decent condition and does not need to be replaced yet. The garage roof, however, is older and in need of replacement. The trustees will discuss options to get this completed during our meeting in September. More to come.



"When we set out to serve others on a mission trip like this, we strive to live out the servant leadership Jesus called us to do. In John 13:15, a prominent scripture for our week in Harrisburg, Jesus says, 'For I have set you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you.' While the theme of the week was about following Jesus so closely that we are 'covered in the dust of our Rabbi', I also found myself thinking about our role as Christians and leaders in that process. You see, we, too, have people who follow us —

FOOD PANTRY

The Oak Creek Centennial Corps Food Pantry on Howell and Centennial Drive also provides a 2-3-day supply of emergency food to neighborhood individuals and families in these zip codes: 53129, 53130, 53132, & 53154, on Wednesday & Thursdays: 9:00 am - Noon; 1st Monday of the month from 2:00 - 5:00 pm.

The food is given on the day it is requested and represents breakfast, lunch, and dinner for all members of the household. Those receiving food are also informed about how they can participate in supplemental food programs so they can move beyond visiting food pantries.

The following are required in order to be eligible:

- Client picture ID (Must have current address and be shown every time).
- School record, Birth Record/Birth Certificate for children in household. If you do not have this information you will only be served for yourself and not the other household members.
- 2 proofs of residence (Mail and utility bill from the last 30 days).

MOBILE MARKET

The Mobile Market is a grocery store on wheels that travels throughout Milwaukee County with grocery staples: fruits, vegetables, milk (dairy & non dairy options), chicken, beef, pork, deli meat, cheese, yogurt,



etc. Canned items or processed foods are not sold here. The market is an active store, not a food pantry or donation center. Prices are 25% off Piggly Wiggly prices. The market accepts debit cards, credit cards and Quest EBT, but no cash.

CULTIVATING MINISTRY FROM THE GROUND UP (CONT'D)

As Pastor Heidi introduced in her article on page one, we are working to better utilize some of the grassy areas on our church property, to do some exciting things! We've gathered ideas from our congregation members over recent months and have prioritized a few of these to get us started.

The Dream:

- Utilize lawn space to serve OCCUMC and our communities.
- Provide more productive and other natural resources to our community and neighbors.
- Reduce current lawn footprint and maintenance costs.

Initial Efforts:

- Establish a vegetable garden.
- Establish a small fruit tree orchard.

Progress:

- We have brainstormed and documented many ideas, recommendations and challenges.
- We have partnered with Rachel Belida (Jim and Diane Wittenberg's daughter) from *Daily Harvest Design* to develop a design proposal for how we might proceed based on our property's opportunities. Rachel's recommendations were reviewed at an open church meeting.
- Based on the input received, we are proceeding with the following initial efforts:
 - 1) Fruit Tree Orchard:
 - ♦ We've received a grant from Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewage District to fund 12 fruit trees, which will be planted on the grassy slope in front of the parsonage.
 - After some research, we have selected 2 pear, 2 peach, and 8 apple trees (Golden Delicious and Cortland)
 - We are actively preparing to plant our new trees in October.

2) Vegetable Boxes:

- ♦ Install a number of raised vegetable boxes this Fall to be ready for use in Spring of 2026.
- ♦ They'll be located on the front corner of the church in the area between the sign and the building.
- Raised boxes will significantly limit weeding and be more comfortable for gardeners.

We have lots to figure out as we get started and we welcome your input. We're energized and excited to be starting the journey of transforming our beautiful church property!
