## The Light of the Season

As winter settles in around us, the days grow shorter and the evenings arrive earlier than many of us would like. For some, these long stretches of darkness can feel heavy. We may find ourselves longing for warmth, for sunlight, for spring. Yet it is often in these very seasons - quiet, cold, and dim - that God invites us to discover a different kind of light.

Scripture reminds us, *"The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it."* These words from John's Gospel are not just poetic; they are deeply practical. They teach us that God's light is not dependent on the season, the weather, or even our circumstances. It is a light that reaches us in the middle of our uncertainty, our weariness, and our waiting.

During these winter months, I encourage you to intentionally look for the small but steady lights God provides:

- **The light of community** — a phone call, a shared meal, a word of encouragement.
- **The light of Scripture** — opening a passage and discovering that God speaks into our very moment.
- **The light of prayer** — not always in answers, but in the simple assurance that we are not alone.
- **The light of creation** — even now, God's handiwork is at work underground, preparing for renewal in spring.

And perhaps most importantly, there is **the light of Christ**, which does not flicker or fade with the season. Jesus meets us in every darkness - personal, emotional, or literal - and reminds us that God is at work even when we can't yet see what's growing.

So as we journey through these winter days, may we practice noticing the light that is already present. May we also be bearers of that light for others, offering kindness, compassion, and hope in tangible ways.

Even in the darkest months, we are a people of hope. And hope, like dawn, always returns.



## FOOD PANTRY



We support our community and neighbors in need by supporting the Salvation Army. Please drop off non-perishable food items at the Salvation Army or visit their website to make an online donation at <https://centralusa.salvationarmy.org/oakcreek/>

The Oak Creek Centennial Corps Food Pantry on Howell and Centennial Drive also provides a 2-3-day supply of emergency food to neighborhood individuals and families in these zip codes: 53129, 53130, 53132, & 53154, on **Wednesdays & Thursdays: 9:00 am - Noon and the 1<sup>st</sup> Monday of the month from 2:00 - 5:00 pm.**

The food is given on the day it is requested and represents breakfast, lunch, and dinner for all members of the household. Those receiving food are also informed about how they can participate in supplemental food programs so they can move beyond visiting food pantries.

**The following are required in order to be eligible:**

- Client picture ID (Must have current address and be shown every time).
- School record, Birth Record/Birth Certificate for children in household. If you do not have this information you will only be served for yourself and not the other household members.
- 2 proofs of residence (Mail and utility bill from the last 30 days).

## MOBILE MARKET

The Mobile Market is a grocery store on wheels that travels throughout Milwaukee County with grocery staples: fruits, vegetables, milk (dairy & non dairy options), chicken, beef, pork, deli meat, cheese, yogurt, etc. Canned items or processed foods are not sold here. The market is an active store, not a food pantry or donation center. Prices are 25% off Piggly Wiggly prices. The market accepts debit cards, credit cards and Quest EBT, but no cash.

## SENIOR STOCK BOX DISTRIBUTION

Hunger Task Force is distributing a box of free, healthy food for seniors at different spots around Milwaukee County. All stockboxes include cereal, milk, canned veggies and fruits, pasta or rice, protein, fruit juice, canned meats and 2 pounds of fresh Wisconsin cheese. Qualifications are:



- 60 years or older (Bring an ID showing your age)
- Monthly household income of less than \$1,632 (1 person) or \$2,215 (2 persons)
- Be a resident of Wisconsin
- Paperwork will be filled out at each site by Hunger Task Force employees.
