

The Task Force will adjust the protocol as necessary, on a monthly basis, upon review of county-level data.



Due to the Positive Covid Tests going above 10% in Milwaukee County, the Covid 19 Metric Task Force has adjusted the Behavior/Parameter to **UNSAFE AS OF JANUARY 2, 2022**. Anything over 10% has been determined by the Wisconsin Council of Churches to be **Unsafe**.

Prayer Shawl Ministry

In 2021, <u>25 prayer shawls</u> were gifted by members of the church to family, friends, neighbors and co-workers who needed comfort during these trying times. In case you wonder how these shawls affect the recipients



I requested a prayer shawl for my sister-in-law who lives in Minneapolis, Minnesota. At the time, she was going through a lot of health issues, including a skin cancer diagnosis. It broke my heart that I was not able to be with her physically so that I could hug her during this difficult time. My daughters and I created a care package for her that included the prayer shawl from church, and we sent it off in the mail with a note letting her know that anytime she needed or wanted a hug from us, she should simply place the prayer shawl around her shoulders and be with God in prayer. We are happy to report that she is completely healthy now, but she still uses her prayer shawl when she needs a pick-me-up!

I have given four prayer shawls or wraps to people who have either been in dire health situations, or who have been the primary care givers to the seriously ill, in 2021. Without exception, the recipient has been thankful, not only for the beautiful and creative skill demonstrated by the work, but for the powerful sentiment behind the gift. Most of the people who have received these gifts from me are not active Christians, but they are amazed that we have a ministry where prayer is acted on in such a personal, creative and intimate way. The giving of these shawls opens the door for me to talk about God's love. If we believe that all tangible things have energy, then the way I understand it is that these shawls and wraps are filled with love. And that love is something that is felt each time the recipient looks at the shawl, or uses it. These shawls are like a lasting hug from God. Sending light and love to all of you, Patty A

The Cathedral Center & Friendship House

THE CATHEDRAL CENTER



The Cathedral Center & Friendship House: Through generous volunteer support and contributions, the meal program provides dinner in shelter 365 days a year. In 2021, this included 16,238 nights of emergency shelter to 224 women and 76 families, including over 160 children.

We continue to accept cash donations so The Center can order food from local restaurants for the Hospitality Meal Program. You can include your

donation with your regular offering by noting the amount you want donated to The Cathedral Center. You may also give online at occumc.org, pick Miscellaneous and enter The Cathedral Center.





The Cathedral Center applies any unused food funds from the Hospitality Program to the Friendship House of Milwaukee (formerly known as the Cathedral Center's Women's Independence Program). This program serves up to 28 unaccompanied women and eight families with children in emergency shelter for up to 90 days, and four unaccompanied women and eight families with children, in flexible housing for up to two years. Families include single mothers, single fathers, two

parent households, and multigenerational amalgamations. A workforce development program is also a part of the Friendship House.

A huge thank you to all who were so generous this year. The Cathedral Center team and the women and children of the center greatly appreciate your generosity. Total donations from February thru December 2021: \$3,515.

- Assists in the distribution of the elements of Holy Communion upon request


• Teaches the Scriptures, doctrine, organization, and ministries of The United Methodist Church <u>Requirements for Certification</u>

Requirements for Certification

- Certified as a lay servant, lay missioner
- Pastor and church council or charge conference recommendation
- Complete a track of study as defined by Discipleship Ministries or the National Plan for Hispanic/ Latino Ministry
- District Superintendent recommendation
- Appropriate screening and assessment
- Conference Committee on Lay Servant Ministries approval after interview with, and recommendation from District Committee on Ordained Ministry

Requirements for Renewal



- Annual report
- Recommendation of church council or charge conference
- <u>Certified Lay Servant and Certified Lay Speaker</u> must accumulate in every three years at least ten approved hours of advanced Lay Servant Ministry courses to renew certification
- <u>Certified Lay Servant</u> must have the approval of the District Committee on Lay Servant Ministries, or equivalent structure
- <u>Certified Lay Speaker</u> must have approval of the Conference Committee on Lay Servant Ministries every three years after interview with and recommendation from the District Committee on Lay Servant Ministries
- Certified Lay Minister must:
 - ♦ Attend in every two years an advanced course or approved continuing education event
 - ◊ Receive District Superintendent recommendation
 - Obtain approval of the Conference Committee on Lay Servant Ministries every two years after interview with and recommendation from District Committee on Ordained Ministry





Dying Lessons: A Love Story, weaves the story of my challenging childhood, having been born seven weeks after my father died, with my research on the dying experience for Wisconsin senior citizens, and offers a view into my experience as the primary care giver for my dying mother. Shining a light on how American senior citizens are dying, most often in environments they would not have imagined, nor desired, I ask the reader to consider how we got here as a society, how we allow medical professionals to be the key players in our beloved seniors' dying experiences, while we anxiously watch from the hallways or call in our concern.

In early 2022, I am planning on hosting book clubs to create safe spaces for this difficult conversation to begin. We will talk about options for end-of-life care, the importance of advanced care directives, and the challenges of navigating grief, but more importantly we will talk about dying as a universal experience, that when viewed as a sacred one, brings us closer to God.


