I am a daughter of the south and a proud graduate of Tuskegee University, Candler School of Theology, Emory University, and Columbia Theological Seminary. I seek a connectional opportunity to continue to work with the duly elected AMEWIM Executive Board and to use my earned degrees, certifications, and love of Christian education to empower, and equip, women through goal-oriented curriculum designs, during the Quadrennium, and at every level of AMEWIM engagement throughout out the connection.

My hope for the office of the Connectional AMEWIM President is to cultivate meaningful conversations concerning the economic, cultural, denominational, and environmental experiences of women, with stakeholders. If elected, to the office of Connectional AMEWIM President, I will leverage my ministerial experience, education, and relationships to continue to advocate for women while also creating leadership opportunities for women, with national partners, as well as at every level of the Connectional church.
