

		<p>For this final week, I encourage you to think of one, two, or three things you are grateful to have learned this year. They can be from any class, or from outside of the classroom. When you have these things in mind, bring these to God in prayer. Thank God for these things you have learned. Then ask him to reveal to you, in your heart, how you might grow closer to him this summer.</p> <p>This could be through prayer, scripture, or service to others (maybe right now, to your family). I would encourage, above all, prayer. Remember, prayer is just having a conversation with God. Be honest about how you're feeling—when things are great, and when they aren't so great. Let God be a part of your life. Ask Jesus to show you his ways.</p> <p>If you don't have a habit of prayer right now, try to develop one this summer; if you do have a habit of prayer, try something new in your prayer life (for example, take time to read scripture, and ask God how he may be speaking to you through it).</p> <p>Know that you all remain in my prayers, and that I miss you very much!
