Respond to the following prompts in the "literature" section of your notebook or on a doc in Google Classroom:  1.Reread pages 56-58. Find two examples of figurative language (simile, metaphor, personification). List each example with its page number. Then explain what the figurative language means.  2.Read the excerpt below from page 74. Explain what Piper's dad means. (Think How persuasive is he? Explain the language that the author uses.)  "My dad says Weasel could convince the hens they're better off with a fox in charge. And then persuade the jury it was in the chickens' best interest to be eaten"(p.74).	Read chapters 13-16 and respond to the questions (in your notebook or on a doc in Google Classroom) below:  1. On page 82, what evidence is there to show that Moose knows Natalie values her buttons? Explain. (Remember to use quotation marks when you quote directly from the text.)  2. What kind of relationship does Moose have with his sister Natalie? Use text evidence with page numbers in your answer. You must explain how the text evidence supports your inference about their relationship.  Review your notes on misplaced and dangling modifiers from last week and from earlier in the year (20 minutes).
