There is nothing lovelier then spending the day at a museum. Luckily for the residents of West Floral Park, we have a fantastic museum right in our backyard. Bowers Museum is located at 2002 North Main Street and is the perfect place to spend a morning or afternoon soaking in some culture and fine works of art.

I remember taking a school field trip to Bowers Museum in elementary school and sadly I had not been back since. The other day I decided to take the morning off and explore what the museum has to offer. I started in their newest exhibit *Dimensions of Form:* Tamayo and Mixografia. This exhibit addresses the legacy of modern master Rufino Tamayo (1899-1991) in a display of his groundbreaking work depicting celestial bodies, animals, and the human form. Over

fifty prints and an 1,800-pound lithograph plate are on loan from the Mixografia studio in Los Angeles.



In 1973, Rufino Tamayo was invited to create a series of prints by Taller de Gráfica Mexicana, a print shop founded by the Rembas family whose legacy reaches back to 1930's Mexico City. Tamayo was eager to incorporate aspects of texture and dimension into his artwork and agreed to collaborate under the condition that the studio develop a technique that would allow him to produce his prints in relief. Relief printing is a method where a printing block, plate, or matrix that has had ink applied to its surface, but not to any recessed areas, is brought into contact with paper. The areas of the printing plate with ink will leave ink on the paper, whereas the recessed areas of the printing plate will leave the paper ink-free.

The shop rose to the challenge by inventing a process that not only allowed Tamayo to create prints in relief, but also registered the artwork's texture and very fine surface detail. Unable to use commercial paper for this new kind of printing, the Rembas family designed and built special paper-making machinery to use in the studio. The name of the print shop was changed to reflect the name of the medium for which it had become known: "Mixografia."

If you haven't had a chance to see this exhibit, hurry over to Bowers before it leaves on January 19, 2020. Also coming to Bowers this month is *Arthur Beaumont: Art of the Sea* which will feature a stunning array of watercolors by artist Arthur Beaumont, capturing the grandeur of the sea and vessels that sail on it. His body of work includes numerous portraits of specific vessels, including mighty aircraft carriers and destroyers as well as personal yachts of presidents and celebrities. Beaumont aimed to portray not only admirals but also common sailors and soldiers.








If you prefer Mickey and his pals over sailing ships, this spring and summer Bowers will house the Disney Archives. The exhibition titled *Inside the Disney Archives: 50 Years of Preserving the Magic* will celebrate the magic of The Walt Disney Company on the 50th anniversary of its archives, with behind-the-scenes access never before granted to the public. The 10,000-square-feet traveling exhibit, which premiered at the D23 Expo Japan in 2018, will offer several rare items on loan only to the Bowers.

After visiting the Tamayo exhibit, I explored the rest of the museum galleries. Some highlights were the Polynesian masks, gemstone carvings, and ancient Chinese pottery. There is also a fantastic wing that features California arts and crafts that shouldn't be missed when visiting.

In addition to its permanent and visiting collections, the museum also offers a wide variety of lectures and activities. While visiting on a Thursday, I got to see first-hand the program *Anne's Treasures* in action. Every week, museum members 62 and older can visit the museum to create their own special work of art. This week almost fifty members were creating decoupage gift boxes and seemed to be having a grand time. The rainy weather certainly didn't stop them from enjoying a day at Bowers.

The museum also offers, lectures, films, classes for chidlren, and other fun activities for the whole family. Make sure to visit their website www.bowers.org for a full list of events and exhibits. The museum is open Tuesday-Sunday from 10:00am-4:00pm and is closed on the Fourth of July, Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Year's Day. Admission ranges from \$10-15 and children under 12 are free. On Sundays, admission is free for all Santa Ana residents! Memberships range from \$50 to \$200 and include a variety of perks and special offers only available to members of the museum.

If you have never visited Bowers, or if you're like me and it's been a few years, be sure to take advantage of this gem located within walking distance to our neighborhood!




WFPNA General Meeting and Board Elections

Neighborhood Watch Report

Earlier this year, the neighborhood started a GoFundMe campaign to raise money for the purpose of hiring a private security patrol on our streets. We had several motivations behind this: 1) to have a conspicuous presence in our neighborhood to discourage potential incidents of petty crime; 2) to have a better log of the number suspicious people (e.g., people who appear high or intoxicated, adults wearing backpacks, people who seem to be snooping in other people's yards); and 3) to have a contact for concerned neighbors in addition to the police non-emergency line.

The GoFundMe campaign was a great success, with generous neighbors donating a total of \$5,650. This was sufficient to hire SafeGuard OnDemand, a local security company, for a three month trial. The trial consisted of a marked car making three patrols per day through West Floral Park. The timing of the patrols were randomized, but typically two were done during daylight hours, and one late at night or early morning. Additionally, the patrol would weave through the neighborhood on different streets to increase the covered area. Every morning, I received a report indicating when and where the patrols had gone the following day, the guard's notes, and an attachment of any photos he took.

The trial has been concluded for several weeks now, and our assessment is mixed. On the positive side, during the trial period crime incidents did seem to be lower, especially in comparison to adjacent neighborhoods. On the other hand, the patrol service did a poor job of documenting suspicious people in our neighborhood and their phone line was cost prohibitive for neighbors to use for non-emergencies.

This issue was discussed at our most recent general neighborhood meeting and, despite the drawbacks, the consensus was to investigate ways to have patrols in our neighborhood on a more permanent basis, whether that be by collaborating and sharing costs with other neighborhoods, or by looking for lower cost alternatives.






