
Celebrations and Plans for the Future

On April 26, 2024, Ebonie came to stay at the BeerLahai Roi Women's Ministries home. She was expecting a daughter due to be born in August. While she waited, she worked part time at a local restaurant and was looking forward to becoming self-sufficient again so she could be a better parent for her baby.

On April 24, 2025, there was a party at the ministry home to celebrate with Ebonie being one year sober. "It took changing the people, places and things in my life," she explained. Certainly, many things have changed over this year

and continue to change as she looks to the future. She is thankful to God for the opportunity to stay



at BeerLahai Roi and all that has been happening for her. "Staying here has allowed me to get back on track," she said "to build a stable life for us. I'm learning what adulting really means, what's important, the difference between needs and wants. I feel confident about our future."

Ebonie has been working to complete her GED online. She is about to begin a pre-CNA course to prepare herself to enter the CNA program at Lincoln Land Community College this fall. She said, "I like helping," as she explained her career choice.

later this year. As she looks into future options for housing and other decisions she will need to make, she asks us to "Pray for guidance" for her. A Bible of Her Own

In January a woman we'll call Lisa came to stay at the BeerLahai Roi Women's Ministries home with her five-month-old daughter we'll call Eliza. They needed

a place to stay while they waited on a list for more permanent housing; and we had an open room.


Part of staying here includes attending church with Debbie, the house mother, and participating together in Bible study during the week. Even before Lisa came to us, she sometimes

went to church and Bible class with someone and saw people marking in their Bibles with multi-colored pens. When she received her own Bible during her stay with us, she was thrilled and immediately said she was going to save up to buy a set of pens so she could write in her Bible, too. Someone did give her those pens, but the point is that she was hungry to

be in God's Word. Having a Bible of her own meant a lot to her.

Before leaving BeerLahai Roi on April 1, Lisa accepted Jesus as her Savior. God used her brief time with us to show Lisa His love for her and Eliza. Even the simple gifts of her own Bible and a few ink pens became part of His plan
