Speaking	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *can demonstrate the ability to engage in conversations beyond survival needs and exhibit oral proficiency by engaging in in-depth conversations. *can prepare and present an oral group presentation on cultures they choose by gathering information from outside sources.
Reading	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *can analyze real-world content-based articles and identify the main idea and supporting details within. *can understand easy short stories adapted from newspaper articles and magazines and respond to a series of objective questions concerning the readings.
Writing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *can produce messages, notes, and related sentences in a paragraph format on personal topics and complete increasingly difficult authentic forms and edit the paragraph for spelling, capitalization, punctuation, and basic grammatical form with some degree of accuracy.
Grammar	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *can use indefinite quantities and amounts, pronouns, nouns, and adjectives. *can differentiate the use of modal verbs for obligations, suggestions, and expectations. *can recognize and use passive voice form in all tenses. *can use causatives to express the idea that one person causes another to do something. *can recognize and use real and unreal conditional sentences and express regrets about past actions. *can use adjective clauses with subject relative pronouns 'who' and 'that' and object relative pronouns 'who, whom, that'.
