

## BCCAT ENGLISH LEVEL ACHIEVEMENT SCALE

Language Domain	Beginner Level
<b>Listening</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>* can demonstrate the comprehension of who, what, where, why, when –vs. yes/no questions in listening comprehension questions.</li><li>* can demonstrate comprehension of simple conversations with basic vocabulary in familiar contexts and respond to questions in listening tasks.</li></ul>
<b>Speaking</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>* can demonstrate the ability to engage in limited social conversations using familiar English words to express basic survival needs in the speaking part of the final exam assessed by a beginner level speaking rubric.</li><li>* can deliver a short oral presentation that includes visuals and at least five simple sentences about a culture of their choice, demonstrating clear pronunciation, appropriate vocabulary, and participation as measured by an oral presentation rubric.</li></ul>
<b>Reading</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>* can identify a limited range of words and phrases drawn from familiar material and construct meaning from simplified print materials on those familiar topics.</li><li>* can understand very easy short stories adapted from newspaper articles and magazines and respond to a series of objective questions concerning the readings.</li></ul>
<b>Writing</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>* can produce simple sentences from previously learned vocabulary by recognizing and demonstrating an understanding of basic vocabulary.</li><li>* can produce and write simple sentences in a paragraph format based on previously learned material or relevant ideas with appropriate details.</li></ul>
<b>Grammar</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>* can recognize and use verbs in the simple present, present progressive, future, and simple past tenses in affirmative and negative statements and questions.</li><li>* can correctly use definite and indefinite articles (a, an, the), form singular and plural nouns, and use appropriate personal pronouns in guided sentences.</li><li>* can recognize and use the comparative and superlative forms of adjectives.</li></ul>
