Language Domain	Intermediate Level
Listening	* can demonstrate comprehension of intermediate level conversations with vocabulary in familiar and unfamiliar contexts and respond to questions in listening tasks of the assessments.
Speaking	* can demonstrate the ability to engage in conversations beyond survival needs and exhibit oral proficiency by engaging in in-depth conversations in the speaking task of the final exam assessed by an intermediate level speaking rubric.
Reading	<p>*can analyze real-world content-based articles and identify the main idea and supporting details within.</p> <p>*can understand easy short stories adapted from newspaper articles and magazines and respond to a series of objective questions concerning the readings.</p>
Writing	* can create a paragraph about a given topic by following the paragraph format with a topic sentence, supporting details and conclusion sentences assessed by a paragraph writing rubric.
Grammar	<p>*can use indefinite quantities and amounts, pronouns, nouns, and adjectives.</p> <p>*can differentiate the use of modal verbs for obligations, suggestions, and expectations.</p> <p>*can recognize and use passive voice form in all tenses.</p> <p>*can use causatives to express the idea that one person causes another to do something.</p> <p>*can recognize and use real and unreal conditional sentences and express regrets about past actions.</p> <p>*can use adjective clauses with subject relative pronouns 'who' and 'that' and object relative pronouns 'who, whom, that'.</p>
