Pastor's Corner

Dear Church Family,

I wanted to share with you (for those who weren't there) the opening speech I gave to the crowd of approx. 550 at the Brookings "No Kings" rally a couple weeks ago. So here it is!

Hello, my name is Mark Johnsen and I am the pastor of the United Church of Christ here in Brookings. I was invited to say a few words this afternoon as a person of the clergy, and yet I recognize that many in this group may be people of a different faith, or may not subscribe to any faith at all. So I am definitely not here to proselytize. But I am here to speak out against the toxic Christian nationalism that has not only taken over our country, but has poisoned and perverted the name and nature of Christ. There are many various views regarding the historicity and essence of this man named Jesus. All we have are the biblical accounts and a few extra-biblical references. But what we read of in the gospel accounts is of a man who taught about loving others as ourselves; about welcoming the stranger; about embracing those who are marginalized and oppressed. In fact, these teachings are at the core of most of our world religions. Yet often, the people who most fervently claim their religious convictions, display the least of these tenants.

In my church right now, I have been preaching a sermon series I've entitled "Dangerous Jesus" in which I'm exploring the various scriptural accounts where the priests and religious leaders of his day were plotting and actively trying to kill him. So the messages he proclaimed resulted in a physical danger to Jesus, but they also posed a danger to the religious and empirical powers who were intent on dominating the people in an effort to maintain their status. They were threatened by the signs that Jesus was displaying, especially during the final week of his life when he cursed a fruitless fig tree as a sign of how the prevailing religion of his day displayed the veneer of beautiful leaves, but was worthless, because it bore no fruit.

Such is the plight of our nation today. We are being governed by leaders who want to portray big ugly bills as beautiful; leaders who care more about power than people; leaders who display the veneer of faith, but bear no fruit. Yet, in the midst of all this darkness there are signs of light and life. Our representatives who are in the minority, are withholding their votes to fund our government as a sign that healthcare for all Americans is more important than tax cuts for billionaires. And all of you here today are also performing signs, as you hold literal signs in the air to demonstrate against the ways in which our neighbors are being abused; how a faith has be prostituted, and how our freedoms and our very democracy is at risk.

So I thank you all for being here; for fighting injustice, and for being a sign that we will not submit; we will not surrender; in fact, we will overcome!
