Pastor's Corner

As the leaves turn and October winds grow crisp, our culture fills with pumpkins and ultimately ends with the costumes and trick-or-treaters of Halloween. This holiday is often seen as one which is purely secular, but its roots are deeply tied to the Christian calendar. Understanding its history helps us see that this season is about much more than candy and costumes—it is about remembering those who have gone before us and the hope we share in Christ.

The word Halloween comes from All Hallows' Eve—the evening before All Saints' Day. Just as Christmas Eve prepares us for Christmas, so Halloween was once seen as a vigil of prayer and reflection leading into the feast of All Saints. In the early church, Christians honored martyrs who gave their lives for the faith. Over time, this commemoration grew into All Saints' Day (November 1), when the church celebrates not only famous saints, but also the countless saints whose names are known only to God. The next day, November 2, is All Souls' Day. This day is set aside to remember all the departed—our loved ones who have died, whether recently or long ago. Christians have long believed it is right and good to pray for the faithful departed, entrusting them to the mercy of God and giving thanks for their lives. So all Saint's Day is a feast day, and All Souls' Day is a day of prayer and remembrance.

The connection between these days and Halloween comes from the way medieval Christians marked the turning of the seasons. Autumn reminded people of the brevity of life. Festivals included prayers for the dead, vigils in cemeteries, and even plays and customs that used humor and mockery to deflate the power of death. In time, these customs mixed with folk traditions, creating the Halloween practices we know today.

So as you see children at your door or at our church on Halloween dressed as superheroes, ghosts, or princesses, take a moment to remember the saints and souls who have shaped your life. Light a candle, say a prayer, and give thanks that in Christ, death never has the last word.
