#### Monthly Celebrations:



# ALERTS

#### Limit eating fish from these waters

The Illinois Department of Public Health has identified three bodies of water in Grundy County and the Kankakee River in Will County that have fish consumption advisories. Heidecke Lake, the Illinois and Mazon rivers through Grundy County have fish consumption advisories warning anglers to avoid eating certain species that may be unsafe due to high mercury levels or PCBs. A statewide methylmercury advisory applies to all Illinois waters, IDPH recommends that women of child bearing age and children limit their consumption of predatory fish (bass, sauger, walleye, flathead catfish, gar, muskellunge, northern pike, trout, and salmon) to 1 meal per week, unless more restrictive advisories are in place. Smallmouth bass longer than 18 inches from Heidecke Lake should be avoided while channel catfish and common carp from Mazon River may contain PCBs, thus eaten only once per week. Illinois River through Grundy County – channel catfish, common carp, white bass and smallmouth bass all contain PCBs limit to 1 meal per month. Kankakee River from Wilmington dam to Illinois River common crap risk of PCBs limit to 1 meal per month while smallmouth bass 15 inches or longer may contain mercury women of childbearing age and children limit to one meal per month. Largemouth bass 15 inches of longer taken from Ponderosa Lake in Kankakee County contain mercury while the Des Plaines River channel catfish, freshwater drum and common carp should not be eaten

### May Questions

Q: I would like to see someone open up some of the culverts on N Prairie Dr. to get it to drain right. A: I understand your concern with the water. I get water in my ditch in the front and the natural drainage in my back yard. There is nothing the association can do about the issue. This is a township issue I know some of us have called the township commissioner is name is Steve Kodat and I would contact the office at 815-942-5706.

**Q**: We change rules without GLA property owners knowledge, have we considered asking the community about rules changes prior to changing them and just sending them out?

**A:** The matter will be discussed by the officers and the board. It is acknowledged that the rules are subject to alteration through a straightforward motion and subsequent board approval. Your apprehensions are justified, and we are actively considering various strategies to engage the community in future decisions. Upon finalizing a course of action, we will ensure to communicate the details to the property owners and hopefully address your concerns.

Q: A question arose about the larger fuel (gas) tanks being installed on properties in GLA.

A: Not being an HOA there is no rule or by laws concerning these fuel tanks being installed. (see below)

The installation of large gasoline tanks on your property is subject to various regulations. Here are some key points to consider:

#### 1. Aboveground Storage Tanks (ASTs):

The International Fire Code (2000 Edition) provides guidelines for aboveground tanks used for outside storage of motor fuels classified as Class I, II, or III-A liquids.

When approved, aboveground tanks must comply with Chapter 34 (Flammable and Combustible Liquids Chapter) and Section 2206.2.3.

Aboveground steel tanks are allowed if their location is approved or within a designated zone or district.

Protected aboveground tank locations have specific separation requirements. Aboveground tanks can be placed in vaults aboveground or below grade.

#### 2. Fire-Resistant Tanks:

A **fire-resistant tank** provides required fire-resistive protection, preventing liquid release, primary tank failure, supporting structure failure, and venting impairment for at least 2 hours. Protected aboveground tanks limit the increase in liquid temperature during fire exposure.

#### 3. Setback Requirements:

For aboveground tanks:

100 feet to the property line (if the property can be built upon).
50 feet to buildings on the same property, dispensers, or the nearest side of a public way.
For protected or vaulted tanks with a capacity of 6,000 gallons or less:
5 feet to buildings on the same property.

#### 4. Diesel Fuel Storage:

Diesel fuel tanks must be registered with authorities. Tanks must be at least **40 feet away from homes or buildings**. A **"FLAMMABLE–KEEP FIRE AND FLAME AWAY"** sticker is required. <u>Tanks should face in an east-to-west direction and be painted white to minimize sun and heat</u> <u>absorption.</u>

#### 5. Propane Tanks:

According to the National Fire Protection Association, propane tanks with a capacity of **501 gallons** to **2,000 gallons** cannot be placed closer than **25 feet to a property line**. Local ordinances may have stricter guidelines.

Remember to check local regulations and consult with relevant authorities to ensure compliance with specific requirements in your area. If you have further questions, feel free to ask!

#### Beach house: Chairperson Lisa Anderson

#### OPENING DAY is May 25th 2024.

We have currently gone thru the process of hiring responsible lifeguards for the 2024 season. We now have a full compliment of dedicated individuals who will be responsible for your safety. We will be developing schedules to assure the beach is open and maned properly during the season.

#### Some additional issue on going we are submitting motions to release funds for the following:

Following a review by several board members, it has been concluded that reinforcing the north wall of the concession stand is not a prudent financial move at this time. The board has instead opted to seek professional evaluations for the repair of the foundation, followed by the reconstruction of the entire north wall. This approach is deemed more financially sound, ensuring that resources are allocated effectively and foundational issues are addressed and no future actions will be required. This season, our focus will be on allocating funds toward the installation of gutters and downspouts along the north side of the building and removing the concrete walk and sloping the grade away for the building. This strategic upgrade is aimed at preventing water infiltration beneath the north wall, which has been the source of our recent issues. By addressing this problem, we aim to enhance the longevity and integrity of our concession stand structure.

To enhance customer convenience, we are asking to upgrade the concession stand by installing Wi-Fi. This will enable the integration of the Clover POS system, allowing patrons to make purchases using credit cards. It will also include the installation of security cameras, along with purchasing other essential equipment for the beach area this will include another lifeguard chair for the east side, additional swimmers ring, a speaker system to alert swimmers, bird netting to prevent birds nesting under the overhang. This modernization effort is part of our commitment to providing a seamless and efficient service experience.

#### Motion submitted requesting funding for a WIFI installation for the beach house, currently on the projects list. Voted on and approved 12-1

#### Motion submitted requesting funding for a gutter installation on north side of the beach house, currently on the projects list. Voted on and approved 13-0

Motion submitted requesting funding for the following equipment, security cameras, bird netting, portable speaker system, safety throw ring, life guard chair for the deep end of beach, currently on the projects list. Voted on and approved 12-0

#### By-Laws: Chairperson Rules and By-laws Marie Stover

The attendance at the by-laws Q&A session on April 10th at the hall was impressive, with an estimated 80 to 100 property owners and board members present. The session was dedicated to a thorough comparison of the changes proposed, providing clear explanations for each and seeking approval from the attendees. It was an informative and amiable meeting, concluding with an interactive Q&A segment following the presentations from both committees.

**Building on the by-laws review, board member Doug Fite** delivered a presentation that was well-received, particularly the communication concerning the increase in dues. Property owners showed their engagement by requesting balance sheets, indicating a proactive interest in the financial aspects. The overall feedback was largely constructive, with only a few negative responses, demonstrating a community receptive to change and transparency.

We have received numerous inquiries and expressions of concern regarding the proposed modifications and the rationale behind the request for an increase in dues. Rest assured, every question has been documented, and the committee intends to address each one thoroughly. Responses to these questions will be provided to all property owners in a comprehensive manner.

#### Below were some of the questions with our responses.

Q: Can we get copies of the agenda prior to the monthly meeting?

A: At present, our meetings proceed without a formal agenda, allowing each board member to discuss old and new business in turn. Should you need them, <u>documents such as the unapproved minutes, the current month's motions, and the</u> <u>balance sheet are available upon request at our office and ready on the Wednesday prior to that month's meeting.</u>

Q:What about the people who don't supply an email or don't have internet access? How do we get information to them? A: We are in the process of establishing a method to inform individuals who have not provided an email address or do not have access to the internet. The Communications Committee is currently exploring options for distributing the newsletter to individuals who either lack email access or have opted not to use it. We are in the process of evaluating various funding strategies to facilitate this initiative for the year 2024.

Q: How do we know where the money is being spent since we don't publish the balance sheet on the website? A: We are currently enhancing our website and establishing a secure method to display the balance sheets. This update will ensure that only GLA members who are current with their obligations will have the ability to access and print these documents. Our goal is to maintain confidentiality while providing our members with the necessary financial information. Q: Have we considered changing some of the office hours to accommodate those who work and cannot make it on the specific days the office is open?

A: We are exploring the adjustment of our hours and focusing our efforts to ensure the most effective support for all our GLA members during office hours.

Q: Have we considered applying a senior rate for discounting memberships etc.

A: The budget committee is tasked with examining this option and presenting their conclusions to the board for consideration. Following this, the proposal will require a vote and endorsement by the property owners of the GLA during the voting at the annual meeting

#### Communication / Public relation: Rich Ferrara

On April 11th, the committee convened with Mr. Dan Rezabek, the head of our IT operations. Our initial agenda is to update and make our site more user friendly and to enhance the security, ensuring that homeowners can safely access information deemed confidential by the board. Subsequently, we addressed the creation of a secure Facebook page and devoted time to planning the newsletters for the forthcoming months.

Our team is developing a strategy to assist property owners who have not provided an email address or do not have access to the internet. This matter will be presented for discussion at the forthcoming board meeting in April, where we will engage with the board of directors to explore potential solutions.

We are in the process of collaborating with Allegra Printing to determine the potential costs associated with biannual newsletter distribution. Our strategy includes seeking advertisers to assist in defraying these expenses. Upon finalizing our approach, we intend to engage with local businesses for advertising opportunities across our various media platforms.

On April 23rd, our team convened to strategize the design of the new GLA website. We've developed a preliminary draft detailing the arrangement of the homepage. Our objective is to streamline the layout to enhance user experience and make it more user friendly and easy to find documentation.

#### **Election Chairperson Pris Copple**

Any member expressing an interest in serving as an officer/director for the two year term shall nominate himself/herself by submitting a signed self-nomination letter to the Association. This self-nomination letter will be sent to you from the GLA office. However, a property owner may only be considered for inclusion on the ballot for the next succeeding election if such signed self-nomination letter is received by the GLA Association at least 60 days (July 23rd) prior to the annual meeting.

The election committee shall prepare a ballot including the names of only the members who duly submitted the approved self-nomination signed letter in accordance herewith and other matters on which a vote is to be taken. At least 30 days (August 22nd) prior to the annual meeting, the election committee shall mail the ballot to all members of record on such mailing date and, if a vote by mail is available as determined by the Board of Directors, the mailing shall contain instructions regarding delivery of the ballot to the Association in order to be valid. No member may be a candidate for more than one elected office. The annual meeting is Sept 21st

We are currently working on getting the self-nomination letters ready to send out to the property owners. So if you want to run for an officer or board member position please be on the lookout for the letter from GLA, complete the nomination letter, and return it to the GLA office.

#### **Use Phosphorus Free Fertilizers**

Please remember to use "Phosphorus Free fertilizer" when you are maintaining your lawns and gardens as this will help to reduce unwanted weed and algae growth in our lakes. Even though your property may not directly border one of our lakes, many of the roadway drainage ditches do drain to our lakes which in turn can place unwanted nutrients an other environmental hazards into our waters.

Phosphorus-free fertilizers can now be found in many of our local stores such as Matteson Ace Hardware, Walmart, Big-R, and Menards. Remember to look for fertilizers marked "lake friendly" or "phosphorus free" with the middle number of "0" as this represents the amount of phosphorus in the fertilizer(example 28-0-3, 12-0-12).

#### Motion submitted requesting to add into the rules,

#### Section 9.0 LAKE WATER USE TREES FALLING INTO THE LAKE

Add to (F) Trees on your property are your responsibility. If your tree falls into the lake and is deemed a safety or navigational issue by the association, property owners must contact the office within 5 days with a plan for the removal of the tree or will be fined \$250.00 plus the cost of tree removal. 7

Lot Numbers must be at least 3 inch letters and numbers in contrasting color to the watercraft.

All new watercrafts must be measured by the GLA Boat Committee prior to obtaining GLA decals.
