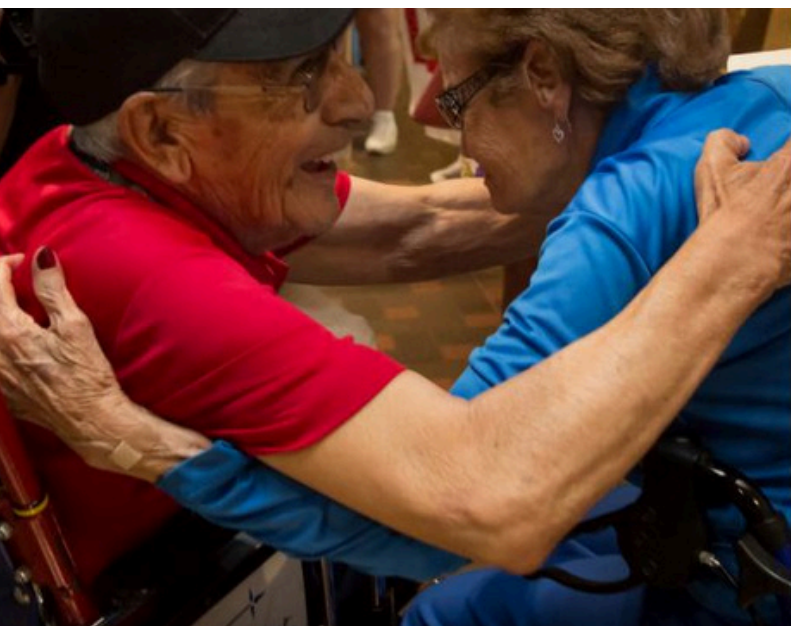

FRIDAY, JUNE 13TH START ARRIVING AT 12:45 PM

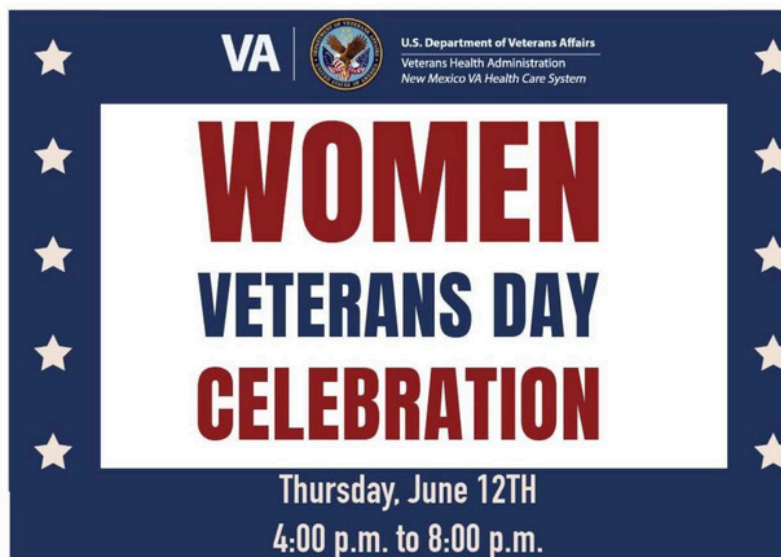

It was a beautiful day and ceremony. As always, it's an gift to be able to honor and remember those who gave all..



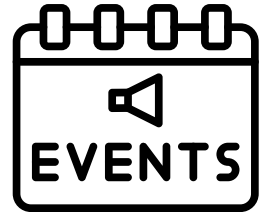

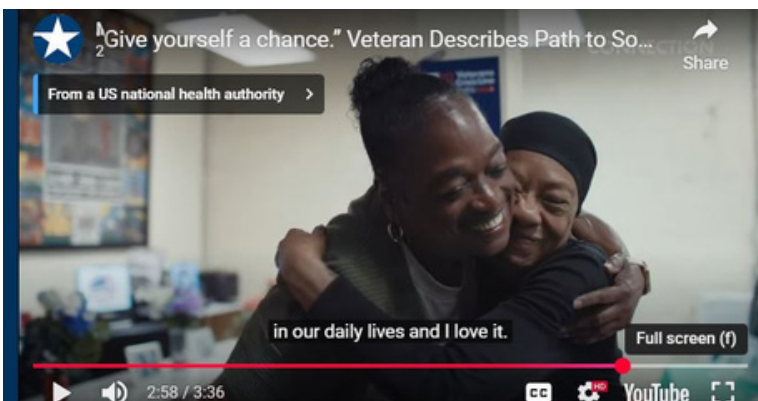
