Jake Kamins is a Senior Assistant Attorney General and Animal Cruelty Resource Prosecutor at the Oregon Department of Justice. He began his career in 2009 at the Multnomah County District Attorney's Office. In 2013, Jake became the nation's first statewide animal cruelty prosecutor, working throughout Oregon. Since then, he has prosecuted hundreds of cases and trained law enforcement, animal services, and rescue agencies nationwide.

Jake also teaches the "Crimes Against Animals" class at Lewis & Clark Law School. In 2023, the Oregon legislature created the Animal Cruelty Resource Prosecutor position at DOJ, largely due to Jake's advocacy.

His awards include Top Ten Animal Defenders (2012) and the Bill Lehman Memorial Award (2022). Jake lives in Portland with his wife, children, cats, and a saltwater fish tank.
