





# Coordinated Public Transit Human Services Transportation Plan

  - Assessment of Transportation Needs for Seniors & People with Disabilities
  - Strategies, Activities, and/or Projects to Address Gaps
  - Priorities For Implementation




#### Age 65+ - Takeaways




- The densely-populated cities have the lowest percentage of population aged 65 or above
- Highest concentrations of those 65+ live in suburban areas adjacent to cities
- The majority of census tracts have a mix of ages






**People with Disabilities - Takeaways** 



- People with Disabilities live in every corner of the region and are not exclusively located in our largest cities.
- Portions of Whitehall Township and Hanover Township (LECO) have among the highest percentages of people with disabilities.






Low Income Census Tracts -


**Takeaways** New Jersey Schuylkill County

- Low-income people live throughout the valley and are not exclusively located in our largest cities.
- Outlying boroughs like Bangor, Roseto, Bath, and Slatington, all have a higher percentage of low-income residents






Zero-Vehicle Households -




- Car-free households are predominantly located in the region's cities.
- Portions of Nazareth, Whitehall Twp, and Hanover Twp (NORCO) are all over 10% zerocar households.






#### Routes - Takeaways




- LANTA has extensive fixed-route coverage over the urbanized areas of the valley
- Fixed Routes roughly align with population and employment density











#### **Map Overview - Takeaways**

- The Lehigh Valley is a diverse region with many different needs
- Age and Ability aren't confined to one area of the region
- Transit-Dependent Households aren't exclusively in the cities





#### **Section 5310 Funding**

- PennDOT Manages All Section 5310 Funding in Pennsylvania
- Agencies are eligible to <u>apply</u> to PennDOT for Section 5310 funding
- Eligible Subrecipients:
  - Local Government Authority
  - Non-Profit
  - Public Transit Operator



#### Eligible Uses of Section 5310 Funds

- Vehicle Replacement
- Fleet Expansion
- •Establishing a New Service

**Typically PennDOT Opens applications in July** 

#### **Selection Criteria**

- Project Need and Justification
- Positive Mobility Improvements
- Local and Regional Coordination
- Technical and Maintenance Capability to Provide Transportation
- Organizational, Financial, and Grant Administration Capacity
- 20% Fund Match Required

  - New & Replacement Vehicles
  - Shelters & Sidewalks
- Operations
  - Additional Services
- Accessibility & Mobility
  - Drivers & Dispatchers
- Policy & Education


