Thy lovingkindness, O LORD, extends to the heavens, Thy faithfulness reaches to the skies. Thy righteousness is like the mountains of God; Thy judgments are like a great deep. O LORD, Thou preservest man and beast. How precious is Thy lovingkindness, O God! Psalm 36:5-7_a

We are faced with a dilemma! The Bible is packed full of scriptures very similar to this psalm king David wrote. We read through them searching for comfort and yet with almost the same breath we point our finger at God and blame Him for all the evil and wickedness we see around us. We struggle to reconcile what we know to be true with the experiences we have while living on this earth. Deep within our spirits we crave the peace, joy, and love expected by all believers in Jesus.

The core of our worldly philosophy rests in the thought that if God is omnipotent, omniscient, and omnipresent than ultimately He can stop all the wars, murders, abortions, diseases, and accidents. Because He has all the power to act and doesn't, in our eyes, do what we think is right, we claim the ultimate blame rests with Him. If we would be honest with ourselves, even though we may not speak it, we believe it in one degree or another.

First of all, we are not the only generation to struggle with thoughts like these. The first century believers were walking away from the Gospel in large numbers. The book of Hebrews is admonishing them to remain faithful in spite of their struggles. The devil loves nothing more than to cause children of God to question His love and care for them. His goal, as current ruler over this world; John 12:31, 14:30, 16:11, is to render powerless these very children of God. As Christians we know this and yet we are still pummeled with these thoughts that are whispered in our ears.

Two thousand years ago, God the Son, set aside His glory to be born a man. His mother became pregnant while yet unmarried bringing potential shame and harm to herself and the child. The moment of birth found the child not in a sterile palace with the best physicians attending the birth but in a dirty stinky barn wrapped in a cloth and placed in a feed trough. By the age of two He had become a fugitive and His family found it necessary to escape the country. When He reached manhood, He was found to have no earthly wealth or pow-er. He didn't even have a place to lay His head. Luke 9:58 country, as a whole, rejected Him and His ministry. He was ridiculed, mocked, spat upon, beaten, accused falsely, unjustly convicted, and executed.

Unbeknown to everyone else, something much greater was happening in all of these things, as we can look back as see the results of what many would consider a failure of a life. God in His omnipotence, omniscience, and omnipresence planned with a purpose every event that transpired in the life of Jesus. During His life here on the earth He never traveled more than a few dozen miles from His birth place and yet his life has changed every person who had or ever will live on this whole earth. Through suffering, Jesus perfected our salvation. When things looked their worst, God was doing a work far beyond anything anyone could ever imagine. This is how God

Matt 6:9 We will also be preparing for His second coming when He will return not as the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world, but as the Lion of the tribe of Judah who will execute justice and judgment upon all those who have rejected Him.



From the Archives

As part of our 2007 centennial celebrations, our congregation organized the Christ for Life Motorcycle Run as a fundraiser for Planet Extreme Center in Princeton, for Appalachian Teen Challenge and for First Christian. It was similar to a motorcycle poker run, but instead of drawing a poker card at each stop, the riders drew a card with a Bible verse on it. Al Bell, Joy Bell and Randal Dawson of our congregation worked with the Mercer County Chapter of the Christian Motorcyclists Association to organize the event, which was advertised via a billboard at the west end of the bridge across the railroad tracks in Princeton.

The run started Saturday morning, May 5, at Cole Harley-Davidson in Bluefield and included stops at check points at Shady Springs, Hinton, Peterstown and, finally, Princeton where the bikers and our congregation had a pig roast dinner with gospel music provided by the Hughes Family and the Appalachian Teen Challenge Choir.
