THE GOOD SHEPHERD

During the Festival of Lights, known as Hanukkah, we find Jesus in Jerusalem after He had healed a man born blind. His teaching that followed the miracle seems mysterious, intriguing, and inviting. Truly, truly, I say to you, he who does not enter by the door into the fold of the sheep, but climbs up some other way, he is a thief and a robber. John 10:1 The teaching appears to be answering the question, "Who is to lead God's flock?" The religious leaders had just expelled the man who received his sight from the synagogue. John 9:34-35 The discourse seems to be directed toward the Pharisees from 9:40 who had asked Him, "We are not blind too, are we?"

Likening the Pharisees to thieves and robbers, Jesus reveals the intention of their hearts, *The thief comes only to steal, and kill, and destroy.* John 10:10 A few months earlier, during the festival of Booths in Jerusalem Jesus accused them, *You are of your father the devil, and you want to do the desires of your father...* John 8:44a

Later in the conversation Jesus will liken the religious leaders to hired hands that do not care for the welfare of the sheep. John 10:12-13 Earlier in His ministry, Jesus was moved with compassion because, they were distressed and downcast like sheep without a shepherd. Matt 9:36 Of course they, the Pharisees, did not understand what those things were which He had been saying to them. John 10:6

Conversely, in reference to false shepherds, Jesus will reveal His mission to the *lost sheep of Israel* Matt 15:24 He will reveal Himself in two different ways; the door and the good shepherd.

I am the door; if anyone enters through Me he shall be saved, and shall go in and out and find pasture. John 10:9 Compared to the robbers and thieves, I came that they (sheep) might have life, and might have it abundantly. John 10:10b reveals Himself as "the" door. Not a door! This is a vital detail! Jesus tells His disciples in John 14:6 I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father, but through Me. Either Jesus was a liar, or He was telling the truth, there is no middle of the road on this one!

Secondly, He declares Himself GoodShepherd 10:11,14 Prophetically, Jesus is once again predicting His suffering and crucifixion as He declares, the good shepherd lays down His life for the sheep. John 10:11 Jesus reveals a very important relationship detail concerning Himself and His sheep; he calls his sheep by name, vs 3, his sheep follow him because they know his voice, vs 4, I know My own, and My own know Me, vs 14 Its not just for Israel that Jesus serves in this capacity, but for us as well. And I have other sheep, which are not of this fold; I must bring them also, and they shall hear My voice; and they shall become one flock with one shepherd. John 10:16 That is, ...those who believe in Me through their (disciples) words. John 17:20 Everyone through the ages down to and including us fall within Jesus words.

There arose a division again among the Jews because of these words. John .10:19 Reaction to His teaching, very much like the teaching itself, has traversed throughout time. Some will get it and some won't, that is just the way it is going to be.

(Just for you "Chosen" fans reading). They accused Him of having a demon and being insane while other recognized the miracles He was doing and adamantly stood with Him.

So, will you stand with the religious leaders and attempt to discredit and even stone Him, or will you, like the man born blind declare, "who is He, Lord, that I may believe in Him? John 9:36 Either Jesus of Nazareth is who He claimed to be, the Son of God the Savior of the world, or He is not. There is no inbetween. As this age comes to a close, mankind is being forced into a position of choosing. Will you follow in the footsteps of Judas and betray Jesus, or like Simon Peter and declare, "Thou are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Matt 16:16

The time has also come where our words must be backed up by our actions. Does Jesus know you by name? Do you recognize His voice? Do you follow Him as He leads you to still waters and green pastures? Do you know how to follow Him? Have you surrendered your heart and life to Him? If you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you shall be saved. Rom 10:9

From the Archives



Rick and Doreen Newton's recent mission trip to help the victims of Hurricane Helene in Asheville, North Carolina, continues a long tradition of mission work by our congregation.

Another hurricane related mission trip occurred during our

centennial year. On March 25, 2007, four men from our congregation—Randall Dawson, Al Bell, Pastor Gary Lyons, and David Coburn—left on a mission trip to New Orleans to help repair damage from Hurricane Katrina. The church had been discussing a mission trip for a while and the group originally intended to put their faith to work outside the United States, but in the aftermath of Katrina, they realized they were needed closer to home.

They worked at the site of Westside Christian Church, which was located in the Algiers section of New Orleans, one of the oldest areas of the city. The church's facilities were destroyed in the hurricane and volunteers have worked tirelessly to build a mission's station; a site that would serve a church headquarters, as well as offer volunteers a place to eat, sleep and organize their restoration projects for the next few years. The group spent much of their week working on the parsonage that would accompany the mission's station. The church pastor's and his wife had been living in a travel trailer near the site and making the best of their situation.
