

Etchmiadzin Cathedral in Armenia is the oldest standing structure to date although many house churches have been excavated as an archeological site revealing evidences of a once vibrant fellowship of believers. Sadly, there are no known churches that were started by the disciples remaining to this day. Within our own community there are many church buildings going unused and dilapidated that once housed a fellowship of believers reaching into their neighborhoods. #### From the Archive



Our second pastor was Charles Nash Williams, who served us from 1916 to 1917.

He was born on November 8, 1876, in Norfolk, VA, to Jas and Martha Williams. He graduated from the College of William and Mary in 1900 and also attended the College of the Bible in Lexington, KY (renamed Lexington Theological Seminary in 1965). He married Josephine Gouldin in

1905 and they had two children, Charles and Louise.

He was baptized in 1888 at First Christian Church, Norfolk, VA, by Rev. Harry Minnick and was ordained in 1901, at the same church, by Dr. William Albert Buxton and Elder J. G. Burroughs.

Rev. Williams pastored congregations in Louisiana, Texas, Virginia, and Ripley, WV, before becoming the minister at First Christian Church in Princeton. The Ladies Aid Society of our congregation purchased the parsonage at 805 Highland Avenue in 1916 and the first occupants of the parsonage were Rev. Williams and his family.

He was then called to Boyd Memorial Christian Church (Charleston, WV), where he stayed from 1918 to 1929. He was appointed to a State Secretary position in 1930 and moved to Washington, D.C. While living in D.C., he became a pastor for Third Christian Church (1934). Rev. Williams retired and then returned to pastor at Third Christian Church in D.C. and in Haskell, TX, in 1942 and 1943, respectively. Before officially retiring, he continued his ministerial career in Maryland, South Carolina, and ultimately at Black Mountain Christian Church in North Carolina. In his final years, Williams moved to Madison, Wisconsin, to live with his daughter. He died on July 7, 1977, at the age of 100.
