Worship Wars

And I saw, as it were, a sea of glass mixed with fire, and those who had come off victorious from the beast and from his image and from the number of his name, standing on the sea of glass, holding harps of God. And they sang the song of Moses the bondservant of God and the song of the Lamb, saying, "Great and marvelous are Thy works, O Lord God, the Almighty; Righteous and true are Thy ways, Thou King of the nations. Who will not fear, O Lord, and glorify Thy name? For Thou alone art holy; for all the nations will come and worship before Thee, for Thy righteous acts have been revealed." And the temple was filled with smoke from the glory of God and from His power... Rev 15:2-4, 8a Through the vision Jesus revealed to John, we get a glimpse into the events that will occur half way through the Great Tribulation period.

Now when Solomon had finished praying, fire came down from heaven and consumed the burnt offering and the sacrifices; and the glory of the LORD filled the house, and the priests could not enter into the house of the LORD, because the glory of the LORD filled the LORD's house. And all the sons of Isreal, seeing the fire come down and the glory of the LORD upon the house, bowed down on the pavement with their faces to the ground, and they worshipped and gave praise to the LORD, saying, "Truly He is good, truly His lovingkindness is everlasting." 2Chr 7:1-3 Something very interesting is how similar these scenes are from ancient Israel to future glory in Heaven.

Two characteristics common to both scenes that have arrested my attention are the worshiping people of God and His palpable, visual, shekinah glory in their midst. The closest thing we find in the church age is on the day of Pentecost with the outpouring of the Holy Spirit as tongues of fire resting on those in the upper room praying and worshiping God. Acts 2:4

Recently I have been pondering the history of worship at FCC Princeton, which had led to some interesting questions; How important was music to our fathers and mothers? How many freely gave of their time and talents to enhance the worship experience? How many resources were invested into the worship experience? Beautiful instruments, choir robes, a truckloads of music sheets and books, paid staff to help direct the volunteers, these were all given, an overflowing quantity at times. The importance of music and worship played an "instrumental role", forgive the pun, in the church experience on any given Sunday morning.

Every generation has faced and will face the "worship wars". The hymns our older generation enjoy were once themselves contemporary. Many of Fanny Crosby's music were refitted bar and saloon songs with Christian lyrics. No one sings the old hymns of the 1800's and so on and so far back even to the Gregorian chants of a millennial ago. The styles come and go as today's contemporary music will one day become outdated and replaced with something different. It's not the style or the instruments that contain eternal value. It is the truth of the message in the songs and the God, the person of focus, that contain the eternal value. It is the God of Creation and His only begotten Son Jesus who give value and eternity to worship. It is because of what they have done, permitting us to share in Their eternity, that has any lasting value whatsoever.

Praise the LORD! Praise God in His sanctuary; Praise Him for His mighty deeds; Praise Him according to His excellent greatness. Psalm 150 is an excellent pattern to follow as we discuss the importance and necessity of worship. Notice there is no discussion about

the things that cause division in many churches, but a focus on the person of God and His works. *Praise Him with trumpet sound;* Praise Him with harp and lyre, Praise Him with timbrel and dancing; Praise Him with stringed instruments and pipe, Praise Him with loud cymbals; Praise Him with resounding cymbals, this listing encompasses just about every possible instrument created by mankind. The final verse of the Psalm clearly summates the true heart of the message; Let everything that has breath praise the LORD, Praise the LORD! Psalm 150:1-6

I led my first worship service as a newly saved seventeen-year-old. It was an evening Bible study and all that I could play on my guitar was "He Is Lord", and "Hallelujah". From that time forward Christian music and leading worship has been an integral part of Teressa and my lives. I believe that it is important to offer a blend of different styles and sounds to engage as many worshippers as possible. If we are truly singing from our heart focusing on exalting and lifting up God our Creator, then we will be able to sing and honor God regardless of the song or style. Its about giving thanks and praising Him for His excellent greatness. Come, let us worship and bow down; let us kneel before the LORD our Maker. For He is our God, and we are the people of His pasture, and the sheep of His hand. Psalm 95:6-7a

Come, let us worship and bow down to the Lord our Maker! God inhabits the praises of His people. Psalm 22:3 Where God's presence is there is hope, healing, and forgiveness. Where God's presence resides there is life, joy and peace.



From the Archive



Our third pastor was John Charlton Reynolds, who served us from 1917 to 1921. Although our information about his pastorate here is sparse, we do know that it was marred by the tragic death of his first wife in 1920.

He was born August 23, 1870, in Craig County, VA, the second son of Ralph C. and Barbara Elizabeth Caldwell Reynolds. He married Elizabeth Holland Shawver on August 26, 1894, at Shawver's Mill, which is about 8 miles east of Tazewell, VA. After Elizabeth's death in 1920, he married his second wife, Sallie Snow Tuggle of Bluefield, WV, in 1926.

While a student at Tazewell College in Tazewell, VA, he was ordained into the Christian ministry and served as a pastor for thirty-three years. In addition to our church, he pastored churches in Ohio, Illinois, Virginia, Tennessee, and Charleston, WV. His final pastorate was at First Christian Church in Erwin, TN. He was well known for his commitment to the principles of the Restoration (Stone-Campbell) Movement. He served as an evangelist in West Virginia and in the Appalachian District of Tennessee and led in the organization and building of several Christian Churches.

He died in Roanoke, VA, on July 20, 1946, and was buried in Craig County, VA.
