For God is not a God of confusion but of peace... 1Cor 14:33a In a world full of turmoil and disorder, we belong to a Creator whose character is contrary to the world we are experiencing. A deeper glance into the cosmos reveals a very detailed organized interlocking system where life and matter not only coexist but are interdependent as well. To much science and mathematics for us ordinary joes, yeah I agree, but a much deeper understanding of a simple truth revealed to the church. As a piece of God's creation, He made us in the same fashion to be beings of peace and order. The turmoil we so often find ourselves in is not the intent or working of our heavenly Father. As a matter of fact, Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made know to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, shall guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Phil 4:6-7 If I desire a deeper understanding of God's character, to take the disorder and turmoil in my life and turn it over to God and allow Him to work, He will make peace and order out of it.

The entire Bible, Old and New Testaments, are full of teachings concerning who God really is, and what He is truly like. Thus says the LORD, "Let not a

wise man boast of his wisdom, and let not the mighty man boast of his might, let not a rich man boast of his riches; but let him who boasts boast of this, that he understands and knows Me, that I am the LORD who exercises lovingkindness, justice, and righteousness on earth; for I delight in these things, declares the LORD. Jer 9:23-24 So much is buried within these two verses; God is searchable! It is achievable to understand and know God! As a matter of the truth, this is something we are to pursue in such a manner where worldly wisdom, strength, and riches, do not even compare. To understand and know God should become the core purpose of our being; body, soul, and spirit. Lovingkindness to protect and provide for, justice to respond in truth and obedience to His Law, righteousness to simply do the right thing according to His word and not our own beliefs or preferences, books can and have been written on each of these individually.

Everywhere we look in the Bible, every author we read, will reveal such hidden and not so hidden truths about the character of God. Our heavenly Father desires to be known by His children. His heart is that we not only find Him but mimic Him in His character following the steps of Jesus Christ, His Son our Lord, as He lived out for us a perfect example. The very word Christian means to be Christlike. The church at Antioch were called this by those unbelievers who recognized this in them. Acts 11:26

How well does His church know Him? How well does His church follow Him? How well does His church disciple new believers in the characteristics of God? It is so very vital that followers of Christ dig deeply into our Bibles and find such passages and allow the Holy Spirit to open our understanding of our Creator and then empower us to be His hands and feet in this chaotic and broken world. May His church be His church.

From the Archives



A letter to the congregation dated May 16, 1944, announced a fundraising effort, Lynchburg College Victory Day, for Sunday, May 21, 1944. Lynchburg College was a Disciples' four-year college located in Lynchburg, VA. In past years, some of our young people attended the college.

The goal of the Victory Day offering was to raise \$500 (1944 dollars), which was our share of the \$60,000 (1944 dollars) that Disciples churches in the area were

trying to raise to relieve the indebtedness of the college. The Board had met prior to the letter, approved the goal of \$500, and appointed a committee consisting of Walter L. White (chairman), Mrs. C.T. Snidow, H.K. Martin and Pastor John Dunn to organize the fundraising effort.

In an indirect comment on the size of our congregation then, the letter notes that the goal could be met if each member would contribute just one dollar.
