Every Pastor also constantly finds he has to confront many different opinions and criticism at the same time, such as:

The Pastor doesn't visit me, Sermon was too long, The music was too loud, The building is too cold etc....

So guess what, they find themselves in a tug-of-war between Which, yes, one of opinions. those things could be true for one and not true for another. Yes the building could be too cold for one person but too warm for another. So how do you choose one over another? Then Pastors constantly find themselves juggling crisis' within a church... multiple families having challenges all at the same time. We need to learn to extend grace and understanding from time to time, because he's just one person, if not, feelings get hurt. But that's why we have deacons and elders to step up and help. Friends, let me share from experience, one of the most difficult things in the life of a Pastor is to know that at some point they may offend or disappoint people they love or let them down.

I want to tell you something that is sad but true. It surprises many people until they pause to think about it and that is, that Pastors are often the loneliest person in the congregation. You may see the Pastor being surrounded by people, but very rarely is it people who are interested in his problems, needs or even in his families lives.

If you love your Pastor, as a friend, take care of them, pray for them, connect with them and the vision that God gave them for the church. Then listen to them, but above all, love them! Remember they are human and in the same way they go through the same needs as you. I promise you that a caring and faithful Pastor calls your name out to God in the prayer, as well as everybody else's in the congregation, at regular inter-Through discernment the Lord will reveal to him, the sheep within the fold that are hurting. Trust me, Pastor Steve will wrestle in intercession for you by name and for all his hurting sheep.

Also many pastors and their families have sacrificed comforts, rest, personal plans and so many things including some of their own needs to attend God's call. I have through the years experienced those, 2 o'clock in the morning calls from parishioners hurting and in trouble. A pastor can't talk about those because of the lives of the people involved. You probably will never hear of them because he has to keep silent. ..But they happen just the same.

Value the time a Pastor puts into his work, the prayers he makes for everyone, the burden he voluntarily carries for his ministry and calling. You don't know how much he'd appreciate knowing you do, and that you pray for him and his family. Send him a card from time to time with a personal note to express your gratitude for what he's done for you and your family. You could even slip a little restau-

rant card in there so they can enjoy a night out together.


#### Christian Women Fellowship

#### From the Archives



Our Zimbabwe project continues a long and distinguished tradition of our congregation in supporting mission work. The chart above shows our giving for missions for fiscal years 1936-1937 to 1948-1949. The amounts shown are adjusted for inflation and presented in 2024 dollars.

The amounts for 1936-1937 and 1937-1938, \$6,851.99 and \$9,134.11, respectively, are the lowest. However, the amounts are remarkable given that the country was in the midst of the Great Depression. The highest amount for this range of years is \$28,880.27 in 1947-1948. This amount also is remarkable since we were raising funds for building the sanctuary during the late 1940s.

We can be very proud of what we have accomplished in Zimbabwe. Not only have we continued a distinguished tradition of our congregation but we have done significant work when our congregation is much smaller than in previous years. Sunday School: 10 a.m. Morning Worship: 11 a.m.
