The Easter Story

Spring time is here again and with it comes the traditional telling of the greatest story ever told. Coming to this time of the year sometimes brings with it questions and even criticisms as to why this story is repeated so often and why could we not celebrate Easter a different way?

Perhaps if we could have sat with Jesus, that final Passover He celebrated, and had a glimpse into what He was thinking and feeling? "As often as you do this", He said, "remember Me". Peter, James, and all of you, early in the morning we will be in one of our favorite places to pray. You will not be able to stay awake and pray with me, but I will. And I'll be in such anguish that the blood vessels in my forehead will rupture and mingle with my sweat. I will be arrested and accused falsely. They will hold an illegal trial only inviting those in authority who are against Me. Matthew, false witness will come forward twisting and falsely presenting my words and teachings. They will mock and strike me whenever I speak what is truth. All this time, my disciples, my friends, you will abandon me. "Peter before the cock crows you will deny knowing me three times." Andrew, there will be no one to stand with me. Early that morning I will be brought before the civil leaders with no one to represent me, no one to help me, no one to be by my side. I will stand alone.

I will be scourged by the Roman soldiers. They will not have any mercy. They will not restrict the lashes to forty less one as does our Jewish custom. They will bring me to the point of death refusing to allow me to

die. They will press a crown of thorns upon my brow. "Take, eat this bread for it is my body which is broken for you." Phillip, I will be forced to carry a cross beam through the jeering and mocking crowds. Yes, Phillip, a cross member, you see tomorrow I will be crucified. They will nail my hands and feet to a Roman cross and raise me up in the air for all to see. "This cup is the blood of the New Covenant which is shed for you. Take and drink it everyone." Bartholomew, while I will be hanging there, I want you to know that I will not be able to breathe. I will be suffocating to death slowly. After all that I already will go through, I will have to put all my weight upon the rod that has fastened my feet to the wood and push myself up just to grasp for a little air as my body struggles to live. My lungs will be filling with blood and other fluids causing great pain as I even receive that air. Thomas, because of the lashes I receive from the Romans, I will look down and see my ribs protruding from my chest. Thaddaeus, I want you to know that after all this happens, the worst is still yet to come. You see, tomorrow as I hang on that cross the sins of all mankind will be placed upon me. The penalty for every child molester, every murderer, adulterer, thief, liar, and everything the heart of man has defiled itself with will be placed upon me. This will force my Father to turn His back upon me as well. You see, He is holy, absolute purity, and no sin can abide in His presence. I have been with Him from eternity past and this separation from my Abba will be more than I can bear. "Let not your heart be troubled, believe in GOD, believe also in

Me." Nathanael, I am doing this for you. Not just you but for everyone, everyone here and everyone who will be. I will be the sacrifice, pure and blameless for all mankind. I will make a way for man, GOD's creation, to come back to GOD. I will stand alone so that you won't have to. I will bear your iniquities, so you won't have to. I will take the lashing for you and for your healing. I will be your High Priest; I will understand your weaknesses and temptations. I will make a way for you to the Throne of Grace that you may receive mercy and my find grace to help in time of need. 'As often as you do this, remember Me.

Of course Jesus didn't tell us these things beforehand. But he knew. He warned the disciples this was coming. Paul explained the purpose for all this suffering to the church in Corinth: He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him. 2Cor 5:21 We have to tell our children and grandchildren, we must let the world know. We must boldly declare like John; Many other signs therefore Jesus also performed in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these have been written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing you may have life in His name. John 20:30-31

May your resurrection celebration be joyous this year.

From the Archives



Our third Timothy was Orville L. Martin. Unfortunately, our information about him is limited He was born in 1923 to Mr. & Mrs. Hubert Kay Martin of Princeton. The house in which the Martin family lived was on Seventh Street on the site of the parking lot of the Harvest Outreach Center church.

He received his bachelor of arts degree from Lynchburg College, Lynchburg, VA, on May 29, 1944, when he was ordained as a minister of the gospel. During his four years of undergraduate work, he was placed on the dean's list for six consecutive semesters. He was active in many social and academic organizations of the college and was elected to many positions of leadership by his fellow students. He was especially active in musical organizations as a member of the A Cappella Choir, the College Chorus, and the Paderewski club. Also, he was active in the religious activities of the college as a member of the Ministerial Association, the Student Christian Association, and the Religious Activities Committee.

From 1947 or 1948 to 1950, he was employed by our congregation as the youth choir director. In addition, he worked extensively with the youth of our congregation and of the community. Sadly, because of budget problems, the funding for his position was discontinued in 1950.

After that, he worked for Graham Christian Church in Bluefield, VA, as the youth director.

He served as pastor of Luray Christian Church in Luray, VA, from the early 1950s until his death in 1984.

He was buried in the Resthaven Cemetery in Princeton.
