All four gospel writers confirm the resurrection occurred Sunday, the first day of the week, following the Sabbath. We find the disciples together in the same room where they celebrated Passover three days earlier with their Rabbi. The women had left at sunrise to finish preparing Jesus' body for burial and we can only imagine the sorrow, fear, and confusion they must have felt as they sat there in silence.

For the previous year and a half, Jesus had been attempting to prepare them for this moment and yet even now they did not understand. They were unable to see the results that would follow the suffering and murder of their King. From childhood they have been taught about the Messiah and what He would do; how He would restore the throne of David and establish His government that would have no end. A very familiar occurrence in those days were for self-proclaimed messiah's to establish an army, start a rebellion, only to be squashed by Rome. Surely Jesus would succeed, they were convinced by the miracles they had personally witnessed, that He was indeed the promised blessing presented in the Old Testament.

The new teaching of the kingdom of God did not fit into the structure that had been built in their thinking. And no one puts new wine into old wineskins; otherwise the new wine will burst the skins, and it will be spilled out, and the skins will be ruined. Luke 5:37 Jesus new teaching about the kingdom would not fit into the old skins of the religious leaders nor their interpretations. Little did the disciples know how they would become the prominent key figures in the church Jesus was beginning to establish. Little did they understand how they would be spreading the Gospel throughout the known world.

It wasn't until the women returned with the surprising news of the empty tomb that the disciples were shaken from their stupor. It wasn't until Jesus appeared to them, that evening, when they began to understand His passion and the fruit that would follow. From that moment forward things would never be the same. Things could never be the same!

Mark's gospel reveals to us; And Jesus uttered a loud cry, and breathed His last. And the veil of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom. Mark 15:37-38 I have a confident expectation that the temple priests immediately began sewing the veil and mending the tear. That is just like mankind! We do not like change. We do not like our status quo altered, nor our comfort zones infringed upon.

Throughout revival history, typically the established religious leadership rejected any movement of God for this very reason. Much like the Pharisees, they become uncomfortable their position and authority come into question. The new wine that God desires to pour out cannot be contained within the old dry wineskins. However, I am confident that an old wine-skin can be softened and renewed if so desired by the work of the Holy Spirit. We find several Pharisees in church leadership in the fifteenth chapter of Acts.

Many are preaching another great awakening is about to occur. Be patient, therefore, brethren, until the coming of the Lord. Behold, the farmer waits for the precious produce of the soil, being patient about it, until it gets the early and later rains. James 5:7 They interpret this passage as the first century church is the early rains and the church just before Jesus second advent as the

later rains. If this interpretation is correct, will the current church establishment and denominations reject a great move of God because their wine-skins are too dry and brittle? Do we cling to our preferences and traditions as if they were Scripture? True moves of God will not step outside the boundaries of Scripture. Will God find other laborers because we are unwilling to be pliable in the Master's hand?

I am firmly confident the Jesus is soon to return to this earth. I believe the next prophetic event to occur is the rapture of His church and the onset of the Great Tribulation. I am very hopeful and pray for another great move of God. My heart's desire is to see many thousands and/or millions come to Christ. I seek a later rain where God pours out His Spirit on this world drawing many to their knees at the foot of the cross. Much like the disciples, I must understand that "my understanding" will not fit into God's plan. God will not conform His will to placate my template for His work. The only thing that I can beg for is that God will make my skin soft and pliable in order to hold His new wine.


Christian Women Fellowship

From the Archives



All of us have been inspired by our beautiful stained-glass windows, which were produced and installed by Hunt Stained Glass Studios in Pittsburgh in the 1960s. Prior to their installation, the sanctuary windows had the mottled pink-purple glass that can be seen in the windows of the back stairwell.

Unfortunately, our records on the project are sparse. The side windows probably were installed in 1963-1964 and the balcony window probably was installed in 1966-1967. We don't have a quote for the project but do have some invoices that suggest the cost for the sides might have been \$2,800 per side and the cost for the balcony might have been \$2,900, for a total of \$8,500, which would be in excess of \$80,000 in today's money. This seems a bit low; possibly our records are incomplete and the cost was higher.

Many of the side windows were funded as memorials. Facing the chancel and going clockwise, the remembrances are (1) Mrs. Milton Warren Christie, (2) Mr. Milton Warren Christie, (3) The C.T. Snidow Family, (4) S.R. Arrington and R.C. Keaton, (5) John H. Hedrick. Sr., (6) By Grace Johnson, Roy Hall and Family, (7) Mr. and Mrs. David W. Johnston, (8) Millard K. Lambert, (9) The J.C. Carter Family, (10) George E. and Hattie E. Charlton, (11) In Honor of Rev. John M. Dunn, (12) H.L. Glenn, (13) Mrs. Dora Dean Chambers, (14) The S.A. Vaught Family, (15) Mr. & Mrs. J.M. Cooke & Mr. & Mrs. W.E.B. Johnston, and (16) Mr. & Mrs. L.J. Symons & Mr. & Mrs. M.V. Crawford.

Some connections between the named individuals and the congregation are known but, sadly, not all are known. However, we can report on a few of them. (2) Milton Warren Christie (along with James H. Johnston) was ordained as one of our first two elders by our first pastor, P.M. Baber. (11) John M. Dunn was a former pastor of our congregation. (12) H.L. Glenn was chairman of building committee for the sanctuary. (16) Mr. & Mrs. L.J. Symons & Mr. & Mrs. M.V. Crawford were the parents-in-law and parents, respectively, of our former pastor, Norman G. Crawford.


