This past month, First Christian Church Princeton WV, has voted to disassociate from the Disciples of Christ denomination. We will continue to be a Christian church and strongly hold a philosophical attachment to the original Stone/Campbell movement.

Throughout this process I have felt a heavy weight upon me as we walked through these steps. Approaching the end of the process, the sense of heaviness had turned into a grieving almost as if I had lost a loved one. Often feeling on the verge of tears, I prayerfully sought God craving His perfect will in this matter. Evaluating these emotions, I have concluded, and feel the need to share, their causes.

Firstly, I love the history and heritage here at First Christian Church. As the railroad was coming to lower Mercer St., the fellowship of believers purchased our current property and built our first sanctuary in 1910. By 1915, they had outgrown that building and began planning for the growth of their membership. What an amazing testimony for a very prominent and foundational congregation right from the beginning of the growth of Princeton down Main Street. At that time, we were a Church of Christ/Christian Church and won't become affiliated with the Disciples of Christ denomination for a few more decades.

Secondly, there will be many

who will not understand our intent or purpose and feel that they have been insulted or demeaned. Our ultimate goal is to honor God our heavenly Father, Jesus Christ His only Son, and the Holy Spirit while showing this love to a lost and dying world. We are thoroughly convinced that the Holy Bible is His true word and the source of our instructions for following Him. We know that we are all sinners and are in desperate need of a Savior. We do not single out particular sins any more grievous than others, outside blaspheming the Holy Spirit and harming children. If sinlessness were the measuring stick for church attendance then our sanctuary would be empty on Sunday mornings. We love all sinners, but cannot in a good conscience condone sin in any form regardless of social pressures and beliefs. The Disciples of Christ denomination has consistently turned its back on the Scriptures, choosing to ignore them or change and twist their meanings. Truth is not subjective to the beliefs of the interpreter but absolute truth is consistent for all peoples all places and all times. Thirdly, unity amongst believers has been of utmost importance to Jesus. His pastoral prayer in John 17 is for us to be one as He and the Father are one. However, when one party chooses to

walk away from truth and begin to follow their own vices and wisdom then fellowship is no longer possible. These issues of separation are not light or minor but carry difficult and strong repercussions. Paul's command in 2Corinthians chapter 6 is our biblical president for the actions we have initiated. The heaviness I have felt is not for our actions but for the denomination and its leadership. I will continue to pray that God will open their eyes to what they are doing and how they are causing many people to turn from truth and believe a lie. I grieve for those who will be unable to understand the reasons for our decision. I pray that they will know that they, and all, are welcome to attend FCC Princeton. They will be loved and welcomed. The church will continue to stand for truth, truth as defined in the Bible, where it will be taught and preached to the absolute best of our ability.

I also feel honored that we have an opportunity to stand for truth in this day and time. When the world seems to be headed in a downward spiral sweeping all cultures and religions with it, we can strive to remain faithful and honor God regardless of the cost. As we walk in faith, we look to see where God is working and quickly move to join Him in His work.

From the Archives

Our congregation's first Timothy was John Reason Sloan.

Mr. Sloan was born February 8, 1884, in Pettry, WV, to David A. Sloan and Emily Lou Cook Sloan. On April 14, 1909, he married Nannie E. Shelton of Princeton. They had one child, Nancy Sloan.

He attended Bethany College, graduating in 1916. He covered part of his college expenses by managing the college bookstore and preaching at a small church near the college. Shortly after graduation, on June 4, he and nine others were ordained at the old Bethany Church.

After graduation, he was pastor of a church in West Union, WV, before going for graduate study at Vanderbilt University, Nashville, TN, where he was also pastor of a church.

He pastored a church in Kentucky and several churches in Virginia: Richlands, Rocky Mount (1930-1934), Vinton (1941-1942) and probably others in the Roanoke Valley.

When an incurable throat ailment made preaching impossible, he used other abilities. He worked as a contractor and was in charge of a very large construction job.

On January 4, 1959, he joined Westhampton Christian Church in Roanoke; possibly on his retirement. He and Nannie lived on Carlton Avenue across the street from Westhampton and, as they got older, were nervous about crossing the street to get to church. Jane Winfrey Holmgren, formerly of our congregation and a member of Westhampton in the 1970s, remembers helping them to cross the street.

He died May 12, 1980, in Princeton at the home of his niece Edith Anderson, who was a member of our congregation. His funeral was preached by Richard Flowers, our pastor at the time, and he was buried in Oakwood Cemetery in Princeton.
