My childhood blessing for the meal is well engrained within my memory. I got so good at it I could pray without taking a breath accomplishing the task in under three seconds. I was champion amongst my siblings.

Although my family at least acknowledged the necessity to offer prayer before we ate our food, they fell far short of truly instilling a sense of sincere thanksgiving to God for His bountiful blessings within my heart. My Christianity defaulted to a checklist of pretentious gestures which did little more than fulfilling my need to complete my religious duties. Where we have failed the younger generations is in our imposition of rules without a true sense of relationship. We and our parents have portrayed for our posterity a religion of going through the motions and adhering to the regulations without a sincere love for God, His Word, and His church. The Western Culture returned from World War II with an economic boom and great prosperity that produced a negative result when it came to instilling a sincere dependency upon God. The following generations proved the adage that "rules without relationship produce rebellion".

This revelation in my own life has forced me to examine not only the practices of my faith but, and more importantly, the motives behind my traditions. So often I find myself going through the motions without my heart engaging in true worship. Then the Lord said, "Because this people draw near with their words, and honor Me with their lip service, but they remove their hearts far from Me, and their reverence for Me consists of tradition learned by rote." exposed the religious leaders of His day as being guilty of the same accusation God brought upon the nation in Isaiah's day. Matt 15:7-9

This religious snare is difficult to recognize. This religious snare is easy to get caught in. Every Sunday Worship service we have the tradition of reading a scripture and having the congregation stand as the scripture is read. I think this is a wonderful outward act of showing reverence to the Bible. Whoever, if that is the only act of reverence we show throughout the week, I would be bold enough to declare that we have fallen into the same rut that the nation of Israel was found guilty of. It is quite simple, and cost us very little, to stand for a moment as the Bible is opened up. Do we actually pay attention as the Bible is read? Do we invest the mental energy necessary to comprehend what we are hearing? If we have a true heartfelt desire to honor God's Word, than we will pick it up during the week, read its words, and seeks opportunities to apply it to our lives. Open my eyes that I may behold wonderful things from Thy law...Give me understanding, that I may observe Thy law, and keep it with all my heart... Thy word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path...Thy word have I treasured in my heart that I may not sin against Thee. Psalm 119:18, 34, 105, 11 Psalm 119 happens to be the longest chapter in the entire Bible. The context of the entire chapter is the Bible; reading it, studying it, memorizing it.

In the early history of our country, our children were taught to read using the text of the Bible. To lazily declare that the Bible is too difficult to understand, the children not only read the King James Version but the old King James Version at that. We give excuse after excuse failing to tru-

ly honor and reverence the Holy Bible in our lives. Somehow we have defaulted to making an idol of the ink, onion paper, 100% genuine artificial leather and gold edging while neglecting the holiness of the truth found within its writings. Jesus declared, *God's Word is Truth* John 17:17

Are we making a pretense of reverencing the Word of God? Do our children and grandchildren see in us a sincere love for the Bible? Do they witness us reading and studying on a daily basis? Are the truths of the Scriptures being played out in our lives, or are we promoting rules without relationship? Are we attempting to enforce adherence to the traditions and customs we were brought up on without displaying God's law in our lives? These days and times in which we live desperately need to witness true followers of Jesus Christ. They need to see a church that not only honors God with their lips but their hearts are far more sincere than their words. They need to experience a people who wholeheartedly sing, "All to

From the Archives



One of the ways of raising money for the construction of our sanctuary was the selling of Victory Bonds, which were sold in the amounts of \$5, \$10, \$25, \$50, and \$100. Donors received a paper bond with the donor's name, date and signatures of the Chairman of the Board, the Treasurer and the Pastor.

The construction of our sanctuary required a loan of \$50,000 (well in excess of a half million dollars in today's money) from the Church Board of Extension. The last loan repayment was in 1958 and the congregation held note burning ceremony on Sunday afternoon, September 14, 1958 to celebrate the event. Dr Ralph E. Valentine, executive secretary of the West Virginia Christian Missionary Society, was the guest speaker. A reception followed. The organizing committee for the ceremony consisted of Pastor Norman Crawford, Associate Pastor Bob Garner, Mrs. Curtis McKenzie, Mrs. Addie Williams, Mrs. Fred Bailey, Fred Cooke, Walter White, Jack Scott and Ed Rule.

A toy box will be available also if anyone wants to donate a toy to the Salvation Army. Please have all food donations and toys in by **Sunday**, **December 10**th.


Fellowship
