And all of it depends quite completely on the historic and viscous blood of God himself, enduring agony on a Roman cross. So to sit praying while Jews go in boxcars to death camps, and to do no more than pray if we can do more than pray, is to mock God, who is not fooled by our counterfeit obe-Eric Metaxas dience. Far too often than not, my spirit parallels that of Lot as he found himself living in Sodom; and if He rescued righteous Lot, oppressed by the sensual conduct of unprincipled men (for by what he saw and heard that righteous man, while living among them, felt his righteous soul tormented day after day with their lawless deeds), 2Peter 2:7-8 Not that I am claiming to be righteous, other than the righteousness of Christ imputed upon me, I find my soul tormented as I witness the conduct of unprincipled men, the lawless deeds, not only leading our great country but propagating the immoral behavior upon the up and coming generations.

Our former pastor Frank Stuck (1932-1943) was an avid radio enthusiast and experimentalist. His interests and efforts lead to the first radio broadcasts of our Sunday morning services. In addition to providing radio resources to the church, he also provided radio assistance to

other organizations in the community as reported in this article from the March 10, 1938 edition of the *Princeton Observer*.

"Airline Opens Schedule, Princeton to Washington

Makes Trip Wednesday From Washington With One Passenger; To Purchase Ten New Planes

Princeton was put more fully on the map by a new airline schedule set up Wednesday when the Tri-State Airline ran its first plane into Princeton from Washington.

Beginning on March 15, the new line will set up flights between Washington and Princeton via Charleston, Morgantown and Martinsburg.

The plane will leave Washington each morning, fly directly to Princeton, thence to Charleston, thence to Morgantown in northern West Virginia, thence to Martinsburg in the eastern panhandle, thence back to Washington that afternoon, the round trip from Washington back to Washington taking about four and one-half hours.

It is reported that line will purchase 10 new planes for the coming season's work.

The placing of Princeton on the southern terminus of this airline definitely puts Princeton on the map as having the most available airport in southern West Virginia.

The Rev. Frank Stuck is installing a new radio outfit at the airport through which the student flyer may contact the groundman at the hangar.

The first trip on the new airline was made on Wednesday, when Bob Mino came in from Washington going to Anawalt, with the first trip from Washington." Sunday School: 10 a.m. Morning Worship: 11 a.m.
