Now it came about after these things, that God tested Abraham, and said to him, "Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am." And He said, "Take now your son..." Gen 22:1-2a According to some rabbinical interpretations, the text might be better read in this manner; God-"Take now your son", Abraham-"Which one?" God-"Your only son whom you love" Abraham-"I love them both" God-"Isaac" God then instructs Abraham to take Isaac to Mt. Moriah, which will one day become the Temple Mount in Jerusalem, and offer up Isaac as a sacrifice to God. The story starts out revealing that this exercise is a "test". This passage forces me to question the purpose for this "test". One might quickly rebut, "to test his faith". The book of Hebrews chapter eleven verse eight through twelve testify of Abrahams faith while following verse seventeen starts out; By faith Abraham, when he was tested, offered up Isaac... So hadn't he already proved his faith? Was not his life up to this point enough?

What aspect of Abraham's faith is God now testing? He left his home, came to Canaan under God's direction, fathered a son in his old age, lived a life of obedience, not that he didn't stumble a couple of times, and now he finds himself being tested in this manner. What was God looking for? Abraham's faith? Didn't God already know? Or, perhaps, God wanted Abraham to know? Know what?

I believe the deepest question in this story had to be answered by Abraham and asked in a manner that left Abraham absolutely assured in his heart of his answer. Abraham, do you love your son Isaac more than you love your God?

Abraham immediately begins preparation early the following morning after speaking with God. We are told that he diligently travels three days and takes Isaac up on the mountain. Until the moment his son is bound, placed on the altar and the knife raised, Abraham had the opportunity to back out. We know God would not have permitted the sacrifice to occur. The writer of He-

brews gives us a clue to Abraham's thinking; *He considered that God is able to raise men even from the dead*... Heb 11:19a Abraham passed.

Did God need Isaac's blood? Does God need anyone's or anything's blood? NO! The blood of the sacrifices is for us. In the same manner as the test was not for God's sake, it was for Abraham's. We too are tested is a similar manner as Abraham, the father of our faith. As Abraham needed to prove to himself that God, the heavenly Father, was first in his life, we too must consistently affirm that He is first in our lives above everyone or anything else.

Every category of our lives can and should be challenged with a similar test that God gave to Abraham. We are given one hundred and sixty eight hours every week. Many struggle even giving God one of those hours on a Sunday morning. And every excuse is given to justify to ourselves we need not gather together as a church family. Weather, sniffles, tiredness and or other events all work to sedate a guilty conscience and justifying our absence. Interestingly, often these folks are found at the restaurant or store following church. One hour a week is .59% of our weekly allotment, slightly over one-half of one percent of our time, is God asking too much for an extra hour of Sunday school or Wednesday Bible study? Now were talking 1.78% of our weekly time allowance. This is less than one-fifth of a tithe. O preacher now you're talking math, no one's got time for this!

Another area of our Christian service to look at is in our giving. Do we love our money more than we love our God? God desires that we use a portion of the resources He has blessed us with, to support His work and church in this world. Does He need our money? The earth is the LORD's, and all it contains, the world, and those who dwell in it. Psalm 24:1

Absolutely not! For ever beast of the forest is Mine, the cattle on a thousand hills. Psalm 50:10 Can


we in faith take the first fruits of the increase and bring it back to God as an offering? Or are we going to put our confidence in the money, "we have earned", to meet our wants and needs? Can we consistently say to ourselves, "God comes first in my life, and I know that He will take care of me and provide for me if I honor Him foremost."

Does God need our time? Does God need our money? How about our prayers, or service, or... you fill in the blanks, everything already belongs to God. So why does He require us to give? You tell me, why did He require Abraham to offer Isaac? It's not about Him, it is about us! Will First Christian Church survive without your attendance, giving, or serving? Good question! Why would God sustain a congregation that is not interested in sustaining itself? Hard words preacher! You are correct, but in this day and time in which we live, hard words are necessary.

As we begin the New Year, our bulletin board will be cleaned off and a fresh question stapled on, "What will we celebrate January 1, 2025?" God does not need us, our money, nor our service, but He chooses to use us. We are the expression of the Kingdom of God on the earth in this age. Will we, like Abraham, offer the best that we have? With such a sacrifice God is well pleased. Will we display for our children and grandchildren that God is first in our lives by our actions and not just our talk? Paul declared; Only conduct yourselves in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ...Phil 1:27a

O God, work in and through us, for Your glory.

# From the Archives



Our congregation's fourth Timothy was Bernard Oakes, who was born November 9, 1930; the second son, third child of Joseph M. and Mertie B. (Lilly) Oakes.

He was a 1948 graduate of Princeton High School and a 1952 graduate of Bethany College. While at Bethany, he met his future wife, Ann Wilson, who he married on June 14, 1954. He continued his education at Lexington Theological Seminary, earn-

ing a Doctor of Ministry degree.

He was ordained June 8, 1952, at the Old Bethany Church, then ordained again a week later in our church. He pastored churches in Akron, OH, Clarksburg, WV, Niles, OH, and Lordstown, OH.

His pastoral work extended beyond his congregation; holding several state and national offices in the denomination. He had a wide range of interests outside the church including being an adjunct professor in the Philosophy and Religious Studies Department at Youngstown State University and working with many community organizations. He was honored several times for his work with those community organizations.

Bernard died in Niles, OH, on April 10, 2022. His funeral was held at Niles First Christian Church then his remains were cremated and interred at Roselawn Memorial Gardens in Princeton.
