"if", the responsibility lies with us to become engaged; spiritually, socially, and politically, by doing! Faith without works is useless.

There are some reading that have been called to civic duty themselves. Our nation desperately needs godly men and women who will shoulder the responsibility for public service. We desperately need Federal leaders to state leaders to local leaders who love and serve the living God and honor His word. We need city council, school board, county commissioners, who ae honest, sincere and strive to serve the community with dignity. Too often we are led by self-absorbed, and self-serving leaders who are only interested in building their own wealth and power. We need to pray for and support such people.

Your freedom wasn't free, your liberty wasn't cheap! I by no means have any right or intention to persuade you for who you are to vote except I am convinced we must vote by our Christian convictions first. We must become engaged in the battle before the war is lost. We are mandated to honor God in every area of our lives which significantly includes the land in which we live. Is your heart stirred whenever, you hear our National Anthem or pledge to our flag? Do your actions support your dedication to our country or are they superficial and empty? Will you honor the memories of those who have given all tha you might live in freedom and liberty? 
Christian Women Fellowship

From the Archives



The organ has been an integral part of our worship services for decades. Our first electronic organ, the Hammond Electric Organ, was purchased either late 1944 or early 1945. In a letter to the congregation, dated March 1, 1945, Pastor John M. Dunn conveys the enthusiasm for the organ, saying "One of the finest contributions ever made to the worship services of this church, is now being made by the new Hammond Electric Organ. No doubt you have been thrilled with the beautiful mu-

sic you have heard rendered by our talented organists. An entirely new atmosphere has been created. God seems just a little nearer. The whole service is more worshipful."

Rev. Dunn's letter is a request for funding to pay the balance owed on the organ. The cost of the organ was \$1,550. The Organ Fund at the time contained just \$200. Individual contributions raised this to \$250 and the church borrowed the balance, \$1,300, from a bank. Subsequent donations brought in \$600. Rev. Dunn's letter reminds the congregation of its near unanimous vote for purchasing the organ and requests the congregation to contribute the remaining \$700 at the upcoming Sunday service on March 4, 1945.

The figure is from Laurens Hammond's 1934 patent application for the device that would become the Hammond Organ.
