#### From the Archives



From Margaret Ann Scott's history of the congregation: "Hal Bailey, Milton Warren Christie, and Brother James H. (Uncle Jimmy) Johnston spent much of their time talking and visiting among those of like faith. Late in 1906 or early in 1907, at the urging of these three, about twenty Princetonians met to make arrangements for a revival to be conducted by the **Rev. George F. Crites** of the Ohio Christian Missionary Soci-

ety. ... The revival was held in the spring of 1907 in the Old Presbyterian Church on North Walker Street. At the conclusion of the revival, the church was organized with fifty-two members."

George Francis Crites was born in Fairfield County, Ohio, on October 26, 1856. He confessed his faith in Hebron, Ohio, in 1873 and was baptized in an Ohio canal on a day when the temperature was  $-3^{\circ}$  F. Rev. Crites was ordained in Newark, Ohio, October 10, 1886. He married Minnie V. Johns in 1888. Following her death in 1896, he married Mary Asenath Sanborn in 1899.

During his career, Rev. Crites held pastorates at thirteen churches in Ohio, preached at 557 churches in Ohio, organized churches in several locations and served as an evangelist in West Virginia.




