THE BOOK

There is one force throughout history that has without question been the greatest influence in shaping our Western Culture. Historians will debate the influences of human creativity and or development of industrial advancements as the catalyst driving the forces that shaped us into what we are today, but the truth be told, these same influences were unable to alter the cultures that preceded ours in the manner with which we were molded.

Take for instance the printing press. Many will credit Johannes Gutenberg and his first western invention in AD1450 as one of, if not the greatest influencer of Western Civilization. Unknown to most, the Chinese had invented a printing press of their own and by AD 972 had printed over 130,000 pages of Buddhist's writings. They actually had invented rotating book cases to house all their writings. It was recorded by Buddhist monk Yeh Meng-te in the middle of the twelfth century, as he traveled throughout eastern China that "in six or seven out of ten temples, one can hear the sound of the wheels of the revolving cases turning day and night." (The Book That Made Your World, Vishal Mangalwadi, Pg 79). He goes on to note that unlike Western Culture, the Chinese press had very little effect upon their culture as it did ours.

It wasn't the processes of how written material made its way into the hands of a populace, but what the intellectual material was that transformed the thoughts, minds, attitudes, and hearts of those who read that material. By far the Holy Bible is the most popular printed text to ever make its way into the public. In the 20th century alone it is estimated that around ten billion copies of the Scriptures were printed. No other written work will even appear in any significant amount as compared to the Bible regardless of how far back into history one may care to travel.

Our Representative form of government that we hold dear first ap-

peared at the foot of Mt. Sinai as the nation of Israel was being established. Women throughout history have been looked upon and treated as second class citizens at best, more than likely as mere property no more valuable than a donkey or mule. Many religions and cultures continue in that belief system even in our "modern era". It wasn't until the Bible, in particular the New Testament, where women began to be treated with respect and an equal partner in this adventure we call life. There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free man, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one is Christ Jesus. Gal 3:28 The social atmosphere that fostered individual responsibility, capitalism, creativeness, social reform, are all introduced and displayed for us in the New Testament Church. It is clearly evident that our Western Culture was indeed molded by the Bible and in particular when it was placed into the hands of the common citizen which the printing press undoubtedly had a role in bringing about.

Today we are watching the demise of our Western Culture and the crumbling of our way of life. We bemoan what we are seeing but fail to seriously consider the causes of this tragic turn of events. The social rejection of the Holy Bible directly correlates to the obvious crumbling of what was once a great culture and nation. We fail to recognize that the more we turn away from the instruction manual given to us by which we are to direct our lives, the further we travel from the wonderful life that that book brought to us.

Ultimately it is the blessing of our all-powerful, all-knowing, everpresent God that produced such an amazing way of life, and it is the Holy Bible that gave us the instruction that enabled those beautiful blessings that we enjoyed. How blessed are those whose way is blameless, who walk in the law of the LORD. Psalm 119:1 How blessed is the man who does not walk in the counsel of the wicked,

nor stand in the path of sinners, nor sit in the seat of scoffers! But his delight is in the law of the LORD, and in His law he meditates day and night. And he will be like a tree firmly planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in its season, and its leaf does not wither; and in whatever he does, he prospers. Psalm 1:1-3

We would be hard pressed to find a Bible believing Christian who will not stand up and shout amen to the reading of these verses. However, we are hard pressed to find Bible believing Christians who take those verses to heart. With all my heart I have sought Thee... Thy word have I treasured in my heart... I have rejoiced in the way of Thy testimonies... I will meditate on Thy precepts... I shall delight in Thy statutes... Psalm 119:10-16 What the Church prefers is to point our fingers at those ugly sinners, whose wickedness, is "bringing this calamity upon us", and fail to realize it is us and our own neglect and rebellion of God's word, causing the downfall of a once great people. From the Archives



In the late 1920s, our congregation was large enough and busy enough that it issued a weekly newsletter, The Princeton Christian.

The October 5, 1929, edition had articles from the denomination about mission work in India, Japan, Africa and Mexico plus an article about livestock kept by Hazel Green Academy (Hazel Green, KY) to feed students. Local news included a contest among Sunday School classes to see which one could contribute the most to increasing the total Sunday School attendance to a goal of

700, fundraising to pay for the older part of our current building, and a convention hosted by the church.

The convention, held on October 15, was the One Day District Convention of the United Christian Missionary Society. Grant K. Lewis, denomination secretary from Indianapolis, IN, led the convention. At the end of the day, a banquet for the attendees was provided the Women's Missionary Society.


