But arise, stand on your feet; for this purpose I have appeared to you, to appoint you a minister and a witness not only to the things which you have seen, but also to the things in which I will appear to you; delivering you from the Jewish people and from the Gentiles, to whom I am sending you, to open their eyes so that they may turn from darkness to light and from the dominion of Satan to God, in order that they may have forgiveness of sins and an inheritance among those who have been sanctified by faith in Me. Acts 26:16-18 In this passage we get the deepest insight into the conversation Jesus had with Saul of Tarsus when He appeared to him on the road to Damascus.

Saul/Paul will always keep this commission before him and can easily be found in his letters. For He delivered us from the domain of darkness, and transferred us to the kingdom of His beloved Son, Col 1:13 A phrase of his ministry that they may turn from darkness to light is such a paramount truth as John emphasized Jesus as the light of the world John 8:12 In Him was life, and the life was the light of men. And the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not comprehend it. John 1:4-5

The traditions of the church understand this to refer to salvation and forgiveness of sins. Unfortunately we stop there and fail to venture into all that God has prepared for us; ... I came that they might have life and might have it abundantly. John 10:10b So many people who love Jesus with all their hearts are still living in; darkness, guilt, shame, embarrassment, rebellion, unforgiveness, bitterness, bigotry, and hatred. Many born again Spirit filled Christians are living in a frustrated fruitless state.

Unresolved baggage from our past continually besets us. As we fail to confront these core issues resorting to addictive behavior in order to medicate the wounds and pains hoping to at least find a temporary reprieve. Satan wants nothing more than to keep us in this darkness, neutralizing our effectiveness in God's kingdom. And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing, in whose case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelieving, that they might not see the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. 2Cor 4:3-4

Far too often, men who have been sexually abused as children grow up to act out sexually in very inappropriate ways usually victimizing children themselves. Our human sexuality is a wonderful gift from God. He has created us in His image. Therefore, Satan will use every tool at his disposal to pervert the very thing that God created beautifully. Here's where the darkness enters, instead of dealing with these issues (the sexual immorality) in our lives, we cover and hide our behavior choosing rather to live in our shame and guilt.

Is the church a safe place? James 5:16a Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another so that you may be healed... How many Christians reading this letter have ever felt safe enough to stand in front of their church family and confess their deepest darkest sins that they are struggling with? Pornography, adultery, homosexuality, sexual abuse of children, alcohol abuse, drug abuse, gluttony, so many things that are definitively destructive to ourselves and those around us and yet we choose to live in this darkness rather than confront and conquer them. Satan wants nothing more than this! Be of sober spirit, be on the alert. Your adversary, the devil, prowls about like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour. 1Peter 5:8

Far too many of us feel utterly hopeless never even daring to believe things can get better. If Jesus truly came that we might have life, and have it abundantly, than He lied or we are missing the boat! Thy word is a lamp to my feet, and a light to my path. Psalm 119:105

Thy word I have treasured in my heart that I may not sin against Thee. Psalm 119:11

The church's answer is "pray harder, read your

Bible more, try harder" often this serves little more than putting a band-aid on an infected wound. The deep wounds and causes that are the catalysts for our addictive behavior must be rooted out and dealt with. I acknowledged my sin to Thee, and my iniquity I did not hide; I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the LORD"; and Thou didst forgive the guilt of my sin. Psalm 32:5 We must seek out believers that we can trust to walk with us pursuing godliness and righteousness. We must break the cycle of this behavior and begin to live before our children and grandchildren a life of power and love. Wives, reverence your husbands, and husbands love your wives, and do not be embittered against them. Col 3:18-19 Put on the full armor of God that you may be able to stand firm against the schemes of the devil. Eph 6:11

I refuse to accept this reality that we are destined to live in our shame, guilt, and darkness producing nothing of value for the kingdom of God. I refuse to give place to the devil any longer. I refuse to hide in my darkness wallowing in my guilt and shame. I refuse to stand on the sidelines and watch the powerful in Jesus do all the work. But in all these things we overwhelmingly conquer through Him who loved us. Rom 8:37 Now the Lord is the Spirit; and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty. 2Cor 3:17 For you were called to freedom brethren; only do not turn your freedom into an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another Gal 5:13 O God set your church free to serve You

The Young People's Society of Christian Endeavor was the first widespread nondenominational youth organization in American churches, which was started by pastor Francis E. Clark to preserve the results of special meetings in connection with the Week of Prayer, January 1881. It soon spread to other churches and ultimately around the world but eventually declined as many denominations withdrew to form their own youth societies.

Our congregation was active in the movement, as reported in an article in the April 4, 1935 edition of the *Princeton Observer*. Long time members will recognize the name Wilson Carter in the list of attendees from our congregation.


"Local C. E. Workers Attend Joint Meeting in Bluefield
