One of West Virginia's major college schools sport the "Thundering Herd". Marco, the furry buffalo has evolved as the school mascot. The phrase was coined by the sports writer Duke Ridgley in 1925. The phrase stuck and is prominent to this day. Although the "Big Green" remains, the "Thundering Herd" portrays a vivid and powerful message.

Webster defines "herd" as a number of cattle or other large animals feeding or living together, a crowd, the common people masses. Jennifer Roling in her article titled "Theories of Herd Mentality" defines a herd as a biological imperative that causes animals to act together as if they were a single-minded organism. Wikipedia parallels as behavior in a group acting collectively without central organization. Learning about particular animal herd behavior makes for a very interesting documentary on how they migrate, procreate, and even protect their young.

Often, humans will behave in what is coined as "herd mentality". The behavior of following the crowd or not thinking for oneself would be categorized under this listing. Mrs. Roling listed two primary reasons for the cause of this phenomena; Pattern-Based model – Individuals follow the crowd, because they assume others know more than they do, or Transmission-Based model – some follow the crowd because of social norms.

The truth is that this herd mentality can be used in either a positive or negative manner. We see this effect within our schools as children will follow the crowd knowing full well the behavior that they are engaging is neither proper nor correct. We also see the effects of those who stood against the crowd and were mocked, ridiculed, and shunned. Sometimes even the courageous actions of a few were able to dissuade the negative movement of the masses. Flipping the coin over we find many positive effects the herd mentality can have on a culture. Many harmful and destructive movements have been diluted and even halted by an effective application of a positive movement.

The psychology of herd mentality is studied and effectively applied to all modern cultures regardless of nationality or geography. The inherit strength in our global social network communications systems has transformed our world into a mass breeding ground to fertilize and cultivate an army prepared to move on command. Many jokingly comment, "If it's on the internet it must be true! Right?" News broadcasts and political speeches are often quotes as established fact and dependable. I have seen within my own extended family, social media used to manipulate and transform the thinking processes of this up and coming generation. Wokeism, coined in the early 1960's whose definition was to be awoke to social injustices and problems in our culture, has become a leading social transformer within our younger generation. However, we have seen this movement, often energized through herd mentality, being used to divide and separate large portions of our population. Many young people have aggressively and vehemently rebelled against their Christian upbringing.

The youth of this generation desperately need to be taught how to think critically, the necessity to diligently search out and find the truth of a matter. We however, have not only failed to teach them, but we ourselves succumbed to the lazy man's attitude of picking the low hanging fruit unwilling to do what is necessary to find the truth ourselves. We fill our minds with senseless garbage and willingly believe what we are told. Paul wrote to his young disciple Timothy; Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly

# dividing the word of truth. 2Tim 2:15 (JKV)

When it comes to utilizing the potential of this herd mentality, the author of Hebrews states; and let us consider how to stimulate one another to love and good deeds, the necessity for us to come together that we might utilize the gifts that we have been given is reflected in the following verse, not forsaking our own assembling together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another; and all the more, as you see the day drawing near. Heb 10:24-25 This world is going to continually digress to a point where the antichrist will easily step into power and manipulate the people. All the more as we see this time approaching, we must be courageous, standing against the overwhelming flood moving against us. The truth of the gospel must be shared in our words and actions without hesitation or apology. Right and wrong, holiness and sin, truth and lies, the Bible clearly defined these and must not be redefined nor diluted. Our church membership and citizenship in this wonderful country must be counted sacred as we diligently serve in truth and honor. **From the Archives** 



James Harrison Johnston, often called Uncle Jimmie, was an organizer of our congregation.

Mr. Johnston was born February 2, 1839, in eastern Virginia. He served as a private in the Confederate Army and moved to Princeton after the Civil War where he married Elvira Givens in 1868 (this union produced a total of ten children). A few years later, he moved to Narrows, VA, where he lived for 35

he moved to Narrows, VA, where he lived for 35 years, returning to Princeton in 1906. While in Narrows, he organized the First Christian Church of Narrows in 1895. He was a talented carpenter and blacksmith and helped in the construction of their first church, which was located on the edge of Narrows. This building was used by the congregation until their current facility on Memorial Boulevard was constructed in the 1950s.

He helped to organize our congregation in 1907. Although a record of his early service to the congregation has yet to be found, he probably served as lay preacher, at least part-time, until our first full time pastor, P.M. Baber, was called in 1910. Not too long after his arrival, Pastor Baber ordained Mr. Johnston and Milton Warren Christie as our first elders.

Mr. and Mrs. Johnston remained in Princeton until their passing; Elvira in 1915 and James in 1918.

Mr. Johnston was the great-great grandfather of Linda Kaluk.

# FCC Safety Team From the Safety Team

The Safety Team has applied for funding for a security camera system from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Nonprofit Security Grant Program.

The world and the neighborhood have changed significantly since our church was built. The days when security meant remembering to lock the church at the end of the day are long gone. On January 19, 2023, the Princeton Police Department did a vulnerability assessment of the building. They noted that there are many hallways and many rooms, most with unlocked doors, and recommended getting a camera system. Because of the complexity of the building, it would be very difficult to detect or find an intruder intent on theft, vandalism or doing us harm.

We have requested \$57,232 from FEMA for a total of 17 cameras plus supporting equipment and software. (Many thanks to Larry Wimmer for connecting us with a competent video systems contractor in the Parkersburg area.) If our application is accepted, we would get funding near the beginning of the federal fiscal year (**October 1**) and the project would be completed before the end of this calendar year.
