RIVIVAL!

Not long after the day of Pentecost, Peter and John had made a routine of going to the Temple to pray. This particular day it was about noon they were entering the Beautiful Gate for the "hour of prayer". A man, who had been lame from birth, was there begging as he had done every day at the gate. Peter draws the man's attention, grabs him by the hand, and raises him up. Acts 3:7 declares that "*immediately his feet and his ankles were strengthened*."

A few very interesting observations from this particular miracle are worthy of our attention. As noted, the man was placed there every day to beg alms of those entering the temple. In vs. 10, the people were testifying to the fact that this was indeed the man who sat "every day" at the gate. With as many times, that are recorded, of Jesus ministering in and round the Temple particularly around Feast Days, had Jesus walked past this man and not heal him? The day Peter and John happened by this man morphed into a tremendous opportunity for the Gospel. But many of those who had heard the *message believed; and the number* of the men came to be about five thousand. Acts 4:4

We can only speculate, but of the times Jesus walked past this fellow, did He smile knowing that one day that lame man would be used for God's glory and the advancement of His kingdom? Had Jesus healed that man early, the events recorded in Acts 3&4 may or may not have occurred, but he, the lame man, would not have been an instrumental part of it. Perhaps Jesus postponed "his miracle", for something far greater to occur!

Often, we seek a miracle from Jesus. Often, we get discouraged when the miracle we seek seems to be postponed, or even gone unanswered. How often in our prayer time does Jesus walk by smiling, knowing that the miracle we seek is not long for the waiting and His timing will produce far more for His glory and His kingdom than we can even think or imagine. Now to Him who is able to do exceeding abundantly beyond all that we ask or think, according to the power that works within us, to Him be the glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen. Eph 3:20-21

As one would expect, speaking biblically, "no small stir" occurred that day. While Peter was preaching to the crowds that were quickly gathering, he said something that has captivated me in my devotion time this week. Repent therefore and return, that your sins may be wiped away, in order that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord: Acts 3:19 The call for repentance of our rebellious sinful lives and returning to the truth of the Scriptures is and always has been fundamental for a relationship with the God of creation, but the rest of that verse has me salivating for a deeper understanding.

Refreshing (an-aps-ook-sis), in the Greek, means recovery of breath, REVIVAL! I have to double take back to that verse. This is what my heart has been crying for. I understand David when he cried out, As the deer pants for the water brooks, so my soul pants for Thee, O God. Psalm 42:1. Then Peter explains how that refreshing came, from the presence of the Lord. The Greek (pros-o-pon) the appearance, countenance, the person of Adoni, I don't feel that this is in reference to Jesus' second advent as vs 20 goes on to say; and that He may send Jesus, the Christ... referring to His Millennial Reign.

God's presence brings with it refreshing of soul and spirit and even sometimes of body as physical healings do occur at these times. Revival throughout the centuries has occurred when God's presence fell upon a community,

city, or nation, resulting in many believers repenting of their sins, drawing closer to the Holy Spirit and serving God as well as unbelievers falling on their knees seeking forgiveness of sins and salvation. Often the religious leadership rejected such movements as they have occurred outside their established structure and control. When God's presence falls, there are no boundaries or barriers that God cannot work through. Therefore let it be known to you, brethren, that through Him forgiveness of sins is proclaimed to you, and through Him everyone who believes is freed from all things... Acts 13:38 -39a Broken hearts and lives are mended, prisoners are set free, those living in darkness are brought to the light, those held captive through the temptations of the flesh are released. Acts 26:18 There will be many lost souls who come to a knowledge of salvation in Jesus Christ.

Repent therefore and return, that your sins may be wiped away, in order that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord; Acts 3:19 Many have been praying for revival to sweep across our land. Many have been praying for revival to sweep across Princeton WV. My prayer is for us all to repent and return to God. The church at Ephesus was challenged by Jesus in Revelation 2:5 Remember therefore from where vou have fallen and repent and do the *deeds you did at first*... I pray for those times of refreshing promised in the scriptures that come with the presence of the Lord. O Lord, see us, hear our prayer, and meet us here.



From the Archives



Our building was constructed in two stages; the educational unit, which was dedicated in 1929, and the sanctuary, which was dedicated in 1951.

The October 13, 1928 edition of the *Bluefield*

Sunset News contains the following story about plans for the laying of the cornerstone of the educational unit.

"New Church Cornerstone to Be Placed in Princeton."

Dr. John Ray Clark, state secretary of Christian churches, of Parkersburg, will deliver the principal address Sunday afternoon at exercises incident to the laying on a cornerstone for a new unit of the First Church of Christ, Princeton. The cornerstone will be laid for the new Bible school unit of the church. Dr. Perry J. Cook, pastor of the church, will preside, and virtually all ministers of Princeton will take part in the program. Sunday school superintendents of the county seat will have a seat on the platform.

The new church unit is being built at an estimated cost of \$53,500, subscribed by members of the congregation. The brick work has been completed, and the contractors have promised the building will be under roof by the last of next week."

According to an article in the October 16, 1928, issue of the *Blue-field Daily Telegraph*, the following items were placed in a sealed copper box in the cornerstone: a complete roll of all who had contributed to the building program; a membership roll of 767 members; a history of the local congregation; one copy each of the Christian Standard, Christian Evangelist, West Virginia Worker (denomination's state newsletter), The Lookout, The Princeton Christian (congregation's newsletter), The Princeton Observer, The Princeton News, and the Bluefield Daily Telegraph, and a copy of the Bible.
