Now the deeds of the flesh are evident, which are immorality, impurity, sensuality, Gal 5:19 Let marriage be held in honor among all and let the marriage bed be undefiled; for fornicators and adulterers God will judge. Heb 13:4 Therefore God gave them over in the lusts of their hearts to impurity that their bodies might be dishonored among them. Rom 1:24

The discussion of our human sexuality and its influence in our lives and its assault by our eternal enemy has not been given the serious attention that it deserves. Far to often I see attacks made from all the different camps upon everyone else that does not believe the way that they do. I pray that you hear me out and consider the argument, unfortunately summated because of space, that I am attempting to make here.





From the Archive



March 18, 1951, was a joyous day in the history of our congregation; our sanctuary was dedicated.

The preliminary sketches of the sanctuary were done in 1927. The educational unit portion of our building was dedicated in 1929 but the planning and construction of the sanctuary was delayed by the need to settle the debt from the construction of the educational unit. Pastor Frank Stuck ran a successful

campaign, entitled "Debt Free by '43", to settle the debt, which allowed the design and ultimate construction of the sanctuary to begin in the mid 1940s.

Two services were held for the dedication of the sanctuary: one at 10:00 AM and one at 2:45 PM. The dedication services for the sanctuary were led by Pastor John M. Dunn with Edward Rule as the choir director and Mrs. H.K. Martin (the mother of one of our Timothies, Orville Martin) as the organist. The messages in the morning and afternoon services were delivered by William T. Pearcy of the denomination's Board of Church Extension. The sanctuary's construction was paid for partially by a loan of \$50,000 (approximately \$620,000 in today's dollars) from the Board.

Also on that day, a dedication service for the chapel was held at 7:00 PM. Ralph E. Valentine, State Secretary and Director of Christian Education for the Christian Churches in West Virginia, delivered the message.
