

Dear faithful parishioners, and you who have come to our church for the first time – welcome!

Glory to Jesus Christ!

Catholics bless animals mainly as a way of recognizing God as the Creator of all life and affirming that animals, too, are part of God's good creation. This practice is most often associated with the Feast of Saint Francis of Assisi (October 4), since Saint Francis is the patron saint of animals and ecology.

Here are the main reasons why Catholics bless animals:

AFFIRMING GOD'S CREATION

- The blessing acknowledges that animals are part of God's creation, entrusted to human care.
- It's a reminder of humanity's responsibility to be good stewards of the earth and treat animals with kindness.

CONNECTION WITH SAINT FRANCIS

- Saint Francis (1181–1226) had a deep love for all creatures, seeing them as brothers and sisters reflecting God's glory.
- Blessing animals on his feast day recalls his spirituality and care for even the smallest parts of creation.

PRAYERS FOR PROTECTION AND HEALTH

- Just as Catholics bless homes, food, or religious objects, animals are blessed so that God's care and protection may be upon them.
- Pets are companions to many families, so praying for their health acknowledges the comfort they bring to human lives.

PASTORAL AND COMMUNITY DIMENSION

• The ceremony is a pastoral moment: it draws people together, deepens their faith, and shows the Church cares about all aspects of life—even their beloved pets.

SYMBOL OF PEACE AND HARMONY

• It expresses the hope for a world where humans and creation live together in harmony, as envisioned in the Bible ("the wolf shall dwell with the lamb..." Isaiah 11:6).

So, when Catholics line up with their dogs, cats, birds, or even farm animals for a blessing, it's not superstition—it's a way of expressing gratitude to God, honoring Saint Francis, and recognizing animals as gifts of creation.




2nd Corinthians 6: 16-7: 1 You are the temple of the living God, just as God has said: "I will dwell with them and walk amoung them. I will be their God and they shall be my people. Therefore, 'Come out from among them and separate yourselves from them,' says the Lord; 'and touch nothing unclean. I will welcome you and be a father to you and you will be my sons and daughters,' says the Lord Almighty." 
