The regular monthly meeting of the Town Council of Mitchell, Georgia, was called to order by Mayor Scott Lamb, on Monday, October 8, 2018, at 7:00 p.m. in the City Hall.

LMIG 2019

Mayor Lamb informed the council that he met with a representative from Turnipseed Engineers regarding cleaning the ditches on Jefferson Street. The council awaits contact from the engineering company before moving forward with the project.

TOWN CEMETERY

Clerk Simmons indicated a need for creating a database for the town's cemetery. The Clerk expressed a desire to track every plot in the graveyard and notate every person buried within each plot. Clerk Simmons stated that she would like to eventually upload a mapping system on the town's website for easy web-based access to the cemetery's records. Lewis Berry made the motion to approve the project; Jacky Haywood second the motion.


Clerk Simmons stated that there are areas on either side of the cemetery that the city could sell for future cemetery plots. The land located between Mount Nebo's Pastorium and the current cemetery has an overgrowth of trees, brush, and foliage on the far peripheral edge of the property. The area requires clearing before offering the plots for sale. The land behind Mitchell's Methodist Church features overgrowth that would easily clear, but the location of the property does not provide easy vehicular access. The council indicated a preference of clearing some of the land on the property next to Mount Nebo's Pastorium.

PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT

County resident Scott Veal offered to donate a piece of playground equipment to the city's park. The council unanimously agreed to accept Mr. Veal's generous donation.
