

Trout Stamp - Required for Trout Fishing:

Must be located on your license. Bait and size limits change each seasons, check local regulations when obtaining stamp.



Trout AILS & TACTICS

They See You: Trout can see colors, including items outside the water.

Hear or Feel You: Lateral lines that run along the trout's sides allow them to detect vibrations - they can feel you! Cascading water can be very loud, but trout are able to easily detect sounds along the riverbank.


Something Stinks: Special holes called "nares" allow trout to detect strange smells in their environment. Flies can be scented to help fool them.


Protect the Ecosystem:

- 1. Mountain trout need clean, cold water under 70 degrees to survive.
- 2. Trees along stream banks shade the water and keep stream temperatures cold so trout can survive.
- Brook and brown trout spawn each fall and rainbow trout spawn in the spring. They dig nests called redds in the gravel, lay their eggs, and then cover them up with clean gravel. Nests are not visible above the water.
- Trees and shrubs also stabilize stream banks and keep the dirt (silt) out of the water, so trout eggs will not be smothered under the gravel.

Protect the ecosystem by maintaining those vegetated buffers along stream banks and not disturbing rocks in the streams.

Anna Ruby Falls - Steep

Length: 0.9 miles out & back

This trail is paved but steep. Benches are located along the trail and observation decks offer beautiful views of York and Curtis Creeks falls.

Dick's Creek Falls - Easy (swimming hole)

North of Dahlonega - Drive north on US 19 to Mt. Piscah Church Road. Look for US Forest Service sign. Turn left on Dick's Creek Rd. and go 2.6 miles to the falls which will be on the left - 100 yards from parking lot.

Dick's Creek to Jarrard Gap - Moderate/Steep 4.3 mile out & back

path least taken, but the beauty that awaits you is worth the rough trail.

Duke's Creek Falls Trail - Easy

Length: 2.3 miles out & back

The first 1/10 mile is wheel chair accessible and leads to a viewing deck so everyone can get a view of the waterfalls. The trail winds through Dukes Creek Gorge. Hwy 348 (Scenic by-way) to paved parking area.

Helton Creek Falls - Easy

Length: 0.3 miles

This short trail descends to the first waterfall then climbs beside the creek to the second and larger waterfall. North on Hwy 19/60 - turn right on Helton Creek Rd. 2.2 miles to the parking area.

Hardman to Helen Heritage Trail - Easy Length: 2 miles out & back

ADA accessible trail follows the Chattahoochee River from Hardman Farm Historic Site to Alpine Helen. This is an Old Gold Mine Trail.

Raven Cliff Falls Trail - Moderate

Length: 5.8 out & back

This trail is in the Raven Cliffs Wilderness Area and follows cascading Dodd Creek upstream to the cliffs. Hwy 348 - north of Duke's creek falls.

Brasstown Bald - Hike or Shuttle To The Top

Is the highest point in Georgia, rising 4,784 feet above sea level and just a short drive from Blairsville, Hiawassee, and Helen.

Russell Scenic Byway

Encircles the headwaters of the Chattahoochee River and is surrounded by the Chattahoochee National Forest. The 43.9 mile scenic loop follows State Highways 348, 180, and 17/75. There are several hiking trails and scenic views along the route. Some of the hiking trails are a section of the Appalachian Trail.

Amazing view from top of this mountain filled with native history. Managed by the USDA Forest Service. From downtown Cleveland, go north 0.3 mile on Highway 129. Turn right onto Georgia Highway 74 and go 2.2 miles. Turn right on Tom Bell Road and go 0.9 mile and take the 2nd right turn onto Chambers Rd. Go 0.7 mile and turn right on Forest Service Road 323. Go 0.3 mile to the trail head parking lot.



SAFETY & PRESERVATION TIPS

There are many picturesque vistas in White County. Here are some tips to make the most of your adventure and preserve these beautiful spaces.

7 PRINCIPLES OF LEAVE NO TRACE

1. Plan Ahead & Prepare

Note the parking location & entrance fees. Supplies should include basic first aid and an extra pair of socks in case your feet get wet.

2. Travel on Durable Surfaces

Stay on the established trail to avoid damage to the land, foliage, or waterways. Best to walk singel file in the middle of the trail.

3. Dispose of Waste Properly

Pack it in, pack it out. Do not leave behind any trash or leftover food.

4. Leave What You Find

The items we find in nature have a role to play, either in the ecosystem or the story of the landscape. Leaving what we find in place helps to preserve both.

5. Minimize Campfire Impacts

For over night hikes, it is best to use a lightweight stove for cooking and candle lantern for light. Campfires should only be built in designated fire rings or pans.

6. Respect Wildlife

Observe wildlife from a distance; DO NOT follow or approach them. Never feed animals because it damages their health, alters natural behaviors, and exposes them to predators and other dangers.

7. Be Considerate of Others

Let nature's sounds prevail; avoid loud voices and noises. Respect others and protect the quality of their experience.

HOW MUCH WATER?

ONE liter of water per hour

Average person takes 30 minutes to hike one mile.

Add 30 minutes for every 1,000 feet of elevation gained.





Teorgia Told Rush

There are several stories of the beginning of Georgia's gold rush; however, no one is really certain who made the first discovery. Some claimed John Witheroods was the first to discover gold when he found a threeounce nugget along Duke's Creek in current day White County. In another version, Jesse Hogan found gold on Ward's Creek near Dahlonega. A third story tells how Benjamin Parks stumbled on a nugget while deer hunting near the Chestatee River. Regardless of the dispute, the year was 1828 and that was the beginning of the "Great Intrusion". Visit the Dahlonega Gold Museum to learn more about our history and stop by one of the many locations to try your hand at panning for gold.




