

# Film Reviews

Garth Bayonne does his duty, month after month, year after year, alone in the dark. Why don't you people ever say thank you?

"Show Me The Monkey"

Finally, someone has had the courage to make a believable monkey film. Rather than spending 90 minutes trying to convince us that monkeys are precocious little people-like things with hearts of gold that always seem to save the day by helping win the big game or foiling the plans of bumbling kidnappers, Nils Flatus shows us how monkeys really act. They are wild, untame little, well...chimps that wreak havoc, make tons of unbearable noise, 'go' wherever and whenever they want, and bite (and bite hard) when threatened. And never, ever, as Hollywood would have us believe, do they comically clasp their hands over their foreheads in an exaggerated "Oh no!" expression when their human handler messes up yet again. Czechoslovakian Underground Film Festival

Well, it's that time of year again, although it seems like we

just got through cleaning up after the last one. The festival lineup: "The Tight Pajamas"

Vyojtek Hyojtek's staggering eight-hour epic kicks off the festival. The film's protagonist, Yuri (Cush Wzoiyt), is a blithering, child-like and instantly contemptible buffoon. That is, until the reason for his wearing the tight pajamas is revealed, some six and a half hours into the film. After that, you're essentially free to skip the remainder of the film, as its conclusion is more an issue of the director running out of film stock than actually having an ending. Bring a pillow. "And Following That..." A History of BBC Voiceover Announcers by Charles Stine, Glossman & Chupp, 530 pages \$32.95.

A sprawling, pedantically researched tree-waster that is of absolutely no value to anyone.

Log On, Stranger: Murder on America's Computer Internet Super Information Highway by Marv Handlin, Knew Era

Publishing, 240 pages, \$22.

Pathetic, implausible cyber-drivel that, apart from giving away the ending every third page or so, spends most of its time claiming that someday soon, "we'll all be able to reach our hands into our computer screens and touch (or, in this case strangle) whoever is at

the other end." Handlin admits in his introduction that he is "still learning" his way around his computer. This book does have one thing going for it. It's made of paper, and here we are with a week or two left in fireplace season.

Sinatra: My Gnome Garden
Photographs by Sy Kovell, Text by
Frank Sinatra, Gambese Publishing,
110 pages, \$75.

A lavish coffee table volume that features the late great Sinatra, tuxedoed and in the twilight of coherence, standing next to his many garden gnomes. Sample text: "This one reminds me of that black kid, the one who was the boxer such a long time ago. Such a wonderful, graceful man.

What was his...he was...the black kid..he was always boxing...he ...FRANKIE! FRANKIE JR! GET THE HELL IN HERE! WHO WAS THAT KID, THE BOXER? WE SAW HIM ON THE TELE-VISION! FRANKIE!...Do you remember how funny that Martha Raye was? She was a spirited woman...and so unique. Yes, there were many lovely, wonderful times."

On The Trail by Elgin Duffy Haycraft, Neo Press, 640 pages, \$34.95.

A must-read for Civil War buffs. Let me correct that. A must for buffs of other Civil War buffs. (This genre seems to be fractioning itself into dust particles.) 'On The Trail' is a biography of Bennett Stern, noted biographer of Lee Wishkin, who many civil war buffs feel, wrote the definitive biography on Samuel Westhaven, mapmaker to Ulysses S. Grant. 


