## The Legal Side of Writing and Publishing

It's very important for writers to protect the copyright of their work, according to lawyer Robert Pimm, who represents clients in the arts, entertainment, and literary fields. Consolidation in the publishing industry means that books are now treated as products. Publishers look at how a book product can be used across multiple media platforms—for example, whether it can be made into a movie, a Netflix series, or merchandise—and it's up to writers to ensure their legal rights are protected across all of these potential media platforms. "Copyrights are actually a bundle of rights and each of these are worth money," he said, "so writers should ensure they're protected for each of them."

Book publishing is about working with others, Pimm said, and many of these relationships should be governed by written legal agreements. Such relationships include everything from editors and agents to publishers and PR consultants. With each of these, it's important to clarify the terms of agreement in detail and—most importantly—who owns the content. An editor, for example, could claim they own content if they contributed significant portions to a book.
