Are we finding it difficult to cope? Have we grumbled to another without pouring it all out to God in prayer? It's not easy to open up and, first of all, recognize and then confess how needy we are. Sometimes we don't know what is wrong and it's not until we start speaking to God about it all that the difficulties begin to unravel within us like untangling a ball of string. One thought leads to another thought which often leads to a confession of all our need.

I remember years ago putting a brave face on a difficult situation. It was a coping strategy. I put my brave face on before my friends and before myself, but one day I couldn't bear it any longer, and suddenly in prayer, I realized my own deep need. Pride had finally given way and I recognized my need of Christ in the middle of this situation. I'll never forget the presence of Christ standing close, bringing comfort with such overwhelming love and compassion for me. I was changed. God was right beside me. I learned a spiritual secret in that hour: being vulnerable and childlike before God made me dependent on God and with that came new strength. God meets our needs in various ways. Don't try and manage life on your own and in your own strength. It's just pride in another form. Become like a child and learn to be dependent on our Heavenly Father. 


