What is an Emmaus Reunion or Share Group?

The Emmaus reunion group or Share Group is a small accountability group of 2 to 6 persons who have usually participated in the 3 day Walk to Emmaus (or Chrysalis Flight) who want to continue their pursuit of a life lived wholly in the grace of God. These small follow-up groups help pilgrims translate the message conveyed on the Walk to Emmaus weekend into a daily walk with Christ. With the regular support of a few faithful friends, the gift of God's love in Jesus Christ becomes a lifestyle of Christian discipleship through the threefold discipline of piety, study, and action.

...these group reunions have a common purpose: to help us persevere in grace. Group reunions undergird our desire to carry those aspects of the three-day experience that we most value and that are fundamental to our formation as faithful Christian disciples into our everyday lives.

FROM THE COMMUNITY SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR

In these totally uncertain days we can easily become discouraged and focus on the negative and very quickly lose our focus on God. God is the one constant we can hold one to. The book of Ephesians is a good place to turn when we are feeling discouraged, or feel like we are under attack by the forces of this world and the forces or evil.

In all circumstances take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming darts of the evil one; (Ephesians 6:16)

Righteousness is our breastplate, and guards our spiritual body and core, a most important protection to be sure. But a shield, like that of our faith, is useful and necessary for defense in every direction. We who are of the faith are attacked from all angles, and in all walks of life. We literally find ourselves in the middle of a 360 degree battlefield. Paul grieved this fact when he said that whenever he wants "to do right, evil lies close at hand" that is from Romans 7:21. So as temptation lurks, and is launched upon us unexpectedly, only a deep rooted faith, connecting our head and our heart is crucial for sustaining our life in Christ.

One commentator reminds us that faith is the "assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen" This comes from a verse in Hebrews 11:1. Essentially, it means our intellectual approval to God's truth, and moral consent to live in light of that truth. Faith is our ever-ready shield because, it takes into account the entire scope of life in all its complexities. Every facet of our life is touched, influenced, and affected by our belief in Jesus as the Word of God. There is no direction we can travel in which Scripture has not spoken to, it is a complete and comprehensive view on human life and experience. And it is our belief and trust in both the written and revealed Word of God that equates to our faith.

Paul called them "flaming darts" because they are poisonous, and inflame when they take root, and take hold in our lives. But the faith that comes by hearing the Word of Christ (Romans 10:17) can extinguish those flaming darts and provide a way of escape from temptation.

So we need to ask ourselves.

What daily activities can you engage in that will bolster your faith, and better connect your heart's belief to your mind's understanding?


