## FROM THE BOARD...

Greetings from the Chair of the Sponsorship Committee. It is fast approaching the next Emmaus Walks for GSVE! Time for Sponsors to get moving! So, what's up with Sponsorship?

According to the dictionary, a sponsor is one who takes responsibility for another. The suffix -ship refers to the skill involved in the activity. Sponsorship is the skill of taking responsibility for another. It is the heart of the Walk to Emmaus Movement. Sponsorship is one of the MOST IMPORTANT aspects of the Walk to Emmaus! The authors of Day Four: the Pilgrim's Continued Journey wrote, "The strength of any Emmaus community is a direct result of that community's recruiting practices." Remember, the primary focus of the Emmaus is the local church where ministry takes place. The object of the Walk to Emmaus is to inspire, motivate, challenge, and equip local church members for Christian action in their home, church, work, and community. Now you may have heard that the Walk to Emmaus is NOT for everyone. Be certain that those you invite are right for Emmaus and that Emmaus is right for that individual. I like to say that over 500 people saw the Risen Christ before he ascended to heaven, BUT only two saw him on the Road to Emmaus! Therefore, when considering whom to sponsor, you will need to be in a spirit of prayer and ask the Holy Spirit first!

The first step to sponsorship is PRAYER. Through prayer, we commit the process to God and ask for His direction. We release to God our control, our desires, and our expectations. We need to be open to God's leading and timing when considering whom to sponsor. This will allow us to be God's instruments in furthering His kingdom. He knows what is best for His ultimate plan and will guide us. Be open to His instruction, even if it does not conform to your expectations! Then finally, when He has revealed a name to you, it is your time to act. Call the person by name. Scripture is clear that God calls us individually by name.

Lastly, consider WISE SPONSORSHIP. The walk to Emmaus is not a hospital to fix those who are spiritually broken. It is not a place for a church to send a problem member to "straighten them out." The Walk to Emmaus cannot do everything; instead, it has a narrowed focus of spiritual renewal of church leaders. That way, the Walk to Emmaus can accomplish its mission of strengthening the local congregations. Start now and get those applications in, ASAP! ## THE COMMANDMENTS OF A SPONSOR



- 1. Thou shalt pray, pray, pray! Pray for discernment as to whom you shalt invite, pray for your pilgrim and their family, pray for the weekend, the community, the team and other pilgrims attending the walk weekend.
- 2. Thou shalt make an appointment to meet with prospective pilgrim to tell them of your Emmaus experience and invite them to attend. Thou shalt discuss the importance of Reunion Groups.
- 3. Thou shalt provide them with an application to complete (or, in the NIV, show them the online application form on www.GSVE.org)
- 4. Thou shalt gather letters of Agape for your pilgrim; as a sponsor you are receiving information prior to the walk which will be helpful in your Agape letter quest for your pilgrim. (Thou art allowed to give special gifts following the closing ceremony after departing the church.)
- 5. Thou shalt call your pilgrim a few days before the start of the walk to remind them of what to pack for the weekend.
- 6. Thou shalt bring your pilgrim to the weekend, make their bed, carry their luggage and tend to their family needs during the walk.
- 7. Thou shalt attend sponsor's hour held in the chapel immediately following the pilgrim send-off (singing, "This Is the Day," as the pilgrims and team head for the conference room). During sponsor's hour, you will hold your pilgrim's cross, pray for them and their weekend and celebrate Holy Communion together with the other sponsors on behalf of the pilgrims and the team.
- 8. Thou shalt have as little contact as possible with your pilgrim during the weekend.
- 9. Thou shalt attend candlelight services, which are held Saturday evening at 8:30 p.m.
- 10. Thou shalt attend closing on Sunday at 4:30 p.m.
- 11. Thou shalt take your pilgrim home after the weekend events are completed.
- 12. Thou shalt help your pilgrim find a reunion (share) group or create a new one
- 13. Thou shalt love and serve your pilgrim to the best of your ability and continue to encourage them in their Fourth Days
- 14. Thou shalt love the Lord your God with all your heart, mind, soul and strength that the other thirteen commandments may be fulfilled!





#### PASTOR DAVE'S THOUGHT

As a pastor, I want everyone to understand the powerful message and meaning of Easter. To be able to communicate this life changing event—I have needed to understand this incredible reality:

Jesus Christ died for my sins, physically rose from the dead, and has given me new life!

"(He) died for all, that those who live might no longer live for themselves but for him who for their sake died and was raised." (2 Corinthians 5:15 ESV)

Easter Sunday celebrates the physical resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. The events that occurred approximately 2000 years ago in Jerusalem permanently changed the world. Every time we write a date, we are using the resurrection of Jesus Christ as the focal point. More importantly, Christ defeated the enemy, atoned for our sins, and opened the door for us to talk personally to God.

I love this day and frankly, celebrate it every day. Easter Sunday reminds me that Jesus really was who he claimed to be. God in the flesh. He came to earth to redeem me and change me. I am a child of God.

On the evening before Jesus was crucified, he had a private meeting with his disciples and explained what was going to happen the next day and how his death and resurrection would change everything.

The disciples loved Jesus and followed him for years. They must have thought, "I don't get it. Where in the world is he going? I'm not going to see him anymore? I'm already alive—what does, 'You also will live,' mean?"

The real meaning of Easter impacted me in ways I can't explain. When I made my decision to serve Jesus, I began experiencing real life. You and I have a life with real meaning, not emptiness or the feeling of being lost. Everyone wants to discover truth, meaning, and a deep sense of peace.

One of the greatest weapons that the enemy uses against us is discouragement. He will continually bombard us and tell us, "Give up. You don't have an abundant life." The enemy created lying. His natural way of communicating is lying. What do we do? Go back to resurrection day, and remind yourself that you have the meaning of life—NEW LIFE through Jesus Christ. We were not made to live for ourselves. We were made to live for Jesus Christ. I have known Jesus for decades and have sensed something that I didn't sense before giving my life to Jesus—meaning, contentment and peace.

Another truth we discover is that the sense of bondage has dissipated. We are free from the continual bondage of sin. Oh, we have our temptations, and we stumble occasionally, but we're free to live a new life in the freedom of God. God gave us a second chance, and he will give us a third, fourth. He will never give up on us.

Thirdly, there is a new energy that we have as God supplies the energy of Christ. He will give us rest and joy—even when we suffer. Wow, do we need His energy.

Celebrating the resurrection day (Easter) and understanding how we are absolutely changed when we believe that he died, rose physically from the dead and is praying for us right now is something we can remind ourselves daily.
