

Please join us in saving Bellevue's Significant and Landmark Trees.

Trees are coming down at an alarming rate, and we have little in place to stop it. Demolition permits have been up 75% in the last decade. Please Join Trees4Livability, a local nonprofit formed by concerned Bellevue citizens, urging the City Council to update Bellevue's tree codes to protect our tree canopy in 2022!

We compiled a detailed Tree Code Study with findings and recommendations, which we're presenting to the City Council before their March retreat. We compared Bellevue's tree codes with other nearby cities. Bellevue's are among the weakest in the region. Sign the petition to show your support!
