From the Attic Files

Clean transcription of the archival Port Delmarva bulletin page. The wording has been kept close to the original; obvious scan artifacts were cleaned up for readability.

We have come a long way from the Port's beginning. Volunteerism, definitely, is the answer why Port Delmarva accomplished so much. Slowly but surely....

I hope newcomers will ask about the Port's history. I'd like them to know just how important it is to be a volunteer here at the Port. The yesteryears' volunteers endured a lot of inconveniences to accomplish this travel trailer park. They kept the operating expenses to a minimum and we all gained so much by their doing so. There will always be a need for volunteering when it is needed, especially, if we all would like to keep the expenditures low. Let's enjoy the park. So please Volunteer! There's something you are capable of doing for the Port.

Last Fall, I mentioned about the Memorial Hall being first as a storage building, but the people wanted the building for a recreational place, too. Later the storage building was built several feet behind the Hall. Not only was the storage building built but also the kitchen, the pump house, the restrooms and Office building and many other things needed which are around the park, all were done by volunteers. Today, the Memorial Hall serves as a meeting place for recreational activities as well as the shareholders' business meetings. Now for the first time we have a temperature-controlled building which was done by contractors as well as a 'face-lift' with dry-wall walls and ceilings. I am sure that some of the Board members observed the changes. The Directors are Volunteers, too and we thank them. I use to hear the comment 'Meet you up at the Building'! I expect to hear this comment more often.

Recently, I was looking through my picture album, I discovered one sequence of pictures of my daughter packing for college, arriving there and readying her dormitory, attending the Labor Day Rally on the old Warrington's farm site and of her father and I taking her and her roommate, Betty, back to the Campus.

That 1971 Rally picture was a good reminder of how our old activities were done. There were several tent-canopies set up, which served as a shady place, only this time it served as a shade over the tables with good food. The people were under the sky, eating and chatting, probably talking about establishing Port Delmarva, also expressing their many, many ideas.

There have been so many changes in trailering here at the park. Some folks are still rallying, some are land-yacht people maybe alternating between here and the South. Some are considering their trailers here as their second homes. Whatever your life-style is, I am glad you are here.

My '74 year book indicates that Port Delmarvans had an active year. Some things went well and some things didn't.

It was the beginning of a whole new life-style for me. Paul had his plans of retirement. We thought things had leveled off for good, but in August Paul had another similar attack which happened at the Mid-way

Freeze. By September, Paul was concerned about the Port. It was in mid-September when we both learned that he couldn't return to work; we were not ready for retirement. Paul said, 'Ann, I have to do something. I've got to do something for the Port. I can't let those people down. Some are like us, who can't travel continuously. We all need a place for the trailers and a place for people to socialize... I have to see people.' I could not deny him of those wishes. I later learned, I, too, needed to be involved in the similar tasks as he had chosen. Now, I thank him and all those many volunteers; also those members of the Port Delmarva Unit who were the first organizers. Paul always said that he wasn't the one to have all the credit. He would say, 'Look to all those Volunteers, nothing could have been done without them!'

The trailers were moved to the new Port Delmarva leased land for only a week, and every single one was taken back to the old site. The Port Delmarvans were too anxious and the Sussex County Council members were slow....there was a mix-up on the final OK for settling on the new site. Let me explain why we took those trailers away. We all felt we could not afford to break the rules of Sussex County Council. It wasn't easy to obtain approval for our park. Fortunately, there were several Port members who knew many of the Planning and Zoning Board members and Sussex County Council members. After many meetings of explaining how the Port would be operated and how it would look.....we finally got the approval. At the time, Sussex Countians strongly disapproved of new campgrounds being established. If you had seen campgrounds in the sixties, you, too, probably would have objected. But, we needed a campground, there were so few around the Sea Coast.

It must of been the week-end of June 28th when all the trailers were permanently parked on the new site. Those who had selected lots near the marsh had a backdrop of thick, prickly bushes, poison ivy, Virginia creeper and unwanted junk. It took weeks for some to clear around the marsh, yet it took years for most of the marsh to be cleared. Some summer flowers were planted around the trailers and in the Circle. Late in October, a few folks had laid thin blocks for their patios. It wasn't all work that summer or fall, there were rallies, the pot luck suppers, and the groups of people chatting....probably the topic included what the Port folks need to do next?

Maybe you, Newcomers will find it hard to believe all my stories on the next topic of the electric, the water and the noisy holding tanks. The old times should be remembered. Maybe you will laugh with me when you read the next newsletter.

Enjoy your stay....it's lot easy-living at the Port than it use to be.

PET SUMMER SAFETY GUIDE

Beat the heat and keep your pets safe this summer!

APPLY SUNSCREEN
Although fur helps provide protection, keep around your pet's mouth, ears, and belly remain susceptible to sunburn. Use sunscreen made specifically for dogs so give your pooch an extra shield from the harmful rays.

DON'T WALK YOUR PUP DURING PEAK SUN HOURS
Avoid walking your dog during the hottest part of the day. If you're unable to walk your dog when it's cooler outside, hire a professional pet sitter.

FIND SHADE
When playing outside, make sure shares plenty of shade for and always make sure your pet has clean, fresh water.

DODGE HOT ASPHALT
Hot concrete and asphalt can burn your pet's sensitive paw pads. If it's too hot for you, it's too hot for your pet.

KEEP YOUR PET HYDRATED.
Always add caution when leaving your dog outside, especially when you're away from home. If your pet is outside, make sure they have access to shade and clean, cool water.

SOME PETS ARE MORE LIKELY TO OVERHEAT
Special care and observation should be taken with dogs who are prone to overheating. This includes short-haired dogs (such as pugs), senior and geriatric pets, as well as pets on medication or those who have specific health conditions such as diabetes and liver or kidney disease.

DON'T LEAVE YOUR PET IN THE CAR
Which leaves your pet alone in a parked car when it's just for a few minutes. Cars can heat up quickly and can cause heatstroke and hyperthermia, which can result in death.

DOG HOUSES AREN'T COOL
Don't rely on a dog house to shield your pup from the sun. Make sure dog houses are in the shade and have proper ventilation because a dog house can be just as dangerous as a hot car.

KEEP YOUR YARD PET-FRIENDLY
Make sure you use pet safe products in your yard. Ants, fleas and certain plants can be toxic to pets.

KEEP GRILLING SUPPLIES OUT OF REACH
Dogs love hanging out by the grill and they might mistake a cooking like charcoal for food and become sick.

BE AWARE OF CAR COOLANT
Coolants that leak from your car or are left out is extremely dangerous for pets. Even a small leak may draw the coolant, which can be fatal.

MY SPECIAL RECEIPE.....from Ron Harvey

CRAB CAKES PORT DELMARVA

Melt 2 to 3 tbsp butter in a frying pan. Add $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ cup each of celery and onion and simmer. Set aside.

In a medium sized bowl, beat 2 eggs and add $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp dry mustard, $\frac{1}{4}$ cup parsley, 1 tsp paprika, $\frac{1}{3}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ tbsp worcestershire sauce. Mix well and set aside.

In a large mixing bowl, breakup 2 slices of white bread in small pieces, $\frac{1}{2}$ roll of Ritz Crackers broken fine. Mix together and then add onion and celery. Mix with a fork.

Add about $1\frac{1}{2}$ lbs crab meat and 2 pinches of Old Bay seasoning and mix.

Add the eggs and spice mix and fold with a spoon until well mixed.

Allow the mixture to rest in the refrigerator for a while and then form into cakes and either broil or pan fry. May be frozen and reheated in the micro.

Note: A special thank you to Ron.....we have been the recipients of his special crab cakes and they are the most delicious we have ever eaten.
