Why are we revitalizing neighborhoods?

Neighborhood revitalization helps fulfill Habitat for Humanity's mission:

Seeking to put God's love into action, Habitat for Humanity brings people together to build homes, communities and hope.

The work of building communities is about connecting neighbors to one another and nurturing the ties that sustain relationships. Habitat's decades of work has shown us that individuals and families thrive when they have a safe and stable home in a safe and stable community. For this reason, it is important to think about the neighborhood that Habitat homeowners and other residents will call home. Participating in community-building efforts allows us to live more fully into our mission.



Neighborhood revitalization mission

Habitat affiliates engaging in neighborhood revitalization serve more families by responding to community aspirations with an expanded array of products, services and partnerships, empowering residents to revive their neighborhoods and enhance their quality of life.

We engage with a focus neighborhood or community



While Habitat's work always has helped individual families, measuring broader effectiveness is difficult with scattered-site efforts. By focusing on a specific neighborhood, good research can be done on overall quality-of-life improvements. Do all residents of the area feel safer? Are they more engaged, more satisfied? If not, what can be refined in the work to improve results?



Neighborhood revitalization begins with understanding the gifts, dreams and concerns of a neighborhood's residents: What do they believe will transform the neighborhood and enhance their quality of life? Habitat is not the architect of revitalization. Instead, we tailor our work to the aspirations and dreams of residents who take on leadership roles in their community's renewal. By ceding the leadership role to residents, Habitat ensures that the work will continue after we move to another neighborhood.

We partner with other organizations and community leaders



We can't do this work alone. We must collaborate with partners who share a common vision, goals and values for the neighborhood and who bring their own areas of expertise to the process, with each organization doing its part to help revitalize the neighborhood.

Habitat offers expertise in partnerships and affordable housing. Partnering with residents and other organizations helps ensure that Habitat's work — from home rehabs to community gardens, from new houses to financial literacy classes — contributes to the fabric of the neighborhood and makes it an inviting place to call home.
