Our volunteer Board of Directors is charged with long-term planning and governance, policy oversight, strategic development, financial management, fundraising and community engagement.

YEAR IN REVIEW

Fiscal Year 2022, which ended June 30, 2022, was a significant year at St. Croix Valley Habitat for Humanity. Like communities across the country, families in Pierce and St. Croix Counties, where our affiliate serves, continue to feel the rising cost of home. Growing demand for affordable shelter continues as people move east from the Twin Cities Metro Area in Minnesota, placing heavy burdens on workforce housing opportunities and placing a greater impact on basic needs in our rural communities. Our small affiliate is working in big ways to help reverse this housing crisis. In FY22, we built a home for a family of 5 in New Richmond and began a second home a mile away for a family of four. Our first "Rock the Block" neighborhood revitalization project was successfully completed in River Falls. We opened our new hybrid ReStore (an online and in-person smaller version of those we've had before) inside our Hudson affiliate office. And we hosted our 25th anniversary in the form of our first Steel Toes & Stilettos Gala. Over the course of all of this, 296 volunteers contributed 4,279 volunteer hours to help make our year happen. We received grants and foundational support from new and longstanding partners who value safe and affordable shelter. And received special funding to install solar systems on two homes, helping reduce homeowner utility costs.

This year, Board member Bill Richard and I completed our 9th and final year in our three terms of service. We've been blessed with tremendous support from our communities in business and foundations and the many volunteers who hammer and drywall alongside our homebuyers. We see the need and we know the challenges continue. So you'll still see us around, there's plenty to do on a committee or special project.





Pierce and St. Croix Counties are shouldering the tremendous growth in population as people headed eastward post-pandemic. Our rural communities are experiencing unprecedented growth and rise in home prices, challenging an already stressed supply of housing stock. As part of the 16-County, Twin Cities Metro Area, our area median home sales price is the same or greater than some of the wealthiest surburbs of Minneapolis and St. Paul (MN).


WISCONSIN HOUSING STATISTICS 2022

- Share of households paying more than 30% of income on housing:
 - 65% of renters earning less than \$50,000
 - 49% of homeowners earning less than \$50,000
- Fair Market Rent needed for a 2-bedroom home in Pierce & St. Croix counties= \$25.56/hour (*minimum wage is \$7.25)
- 28% of Pierce & 23% of St. Croix County households are renters
- Income needed to purchase a median-priced home in Wisconsin = \$49,857
