University Students Consensus

In October 2023, ACF started soliciting feedback from our college students in the form of monthly email reports. What started as a way to get to know our students better and monitor their well-being has now expanded into soliciting their opinions about potential program improvements. After all, there is no better source of information for the ACF education program than the very students who have lived it!

Recently, we polled our college students about how to make the most beneficial impact on their Maasai families and villages near Amboseli NP.

Given four choices, a majority of students selected clean water and improved sanitation as their preferred option.

Other options included ***livestock training, micro-loans to start a business or small scale farming.***

Based on this feedback, Leonard is already testing a Chujio water filter that may be of great help to our families and we have given our first micro-loan to our eldest student Milton (details to follow).



ACF will be focusing its near term development efforts on clean water and sanitation projects. Stay tuned to this space for exciting news in the future!

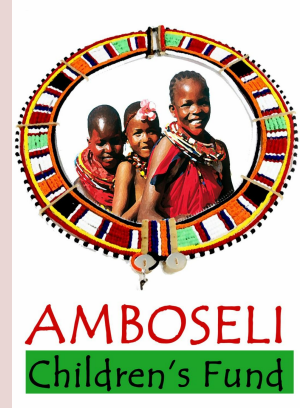
