entrepreneurship. After submitting a business plan and projected budget to our board, Milton became the first recipient of an ACF microloan. Working with Leonard, he rented space and built the structure for the shop. He purchased point of sale equipment and a small freezer to store the goats meat. He calls his shop Nareto Butchery and it is located in the growing town of Kimana.

Currently, all he can sell is goats meat. He will cook it if requested and even offers delivery.

Down the road additional funds will be needed to purchase a larger freezer for cows meat and further growth. But for now, we are all quite pleased with

Not only would this open many doors for her future - it would keep her close to family and home. A win for everyone!






